# **Classroom News Alert**

# **The Preschool Heroes**

AM/PM and Head Start 3 students are learning about exercise this month. The AM/PM students will be learning about exercise and being clean and how those activities help us to be healthy, alert, and energized. The Head Start 3 students are focusing on what we know about exercise and the different kinds of exercises we can do. The students will be engaging in discussions and will have the opportunity to participate in fun exercise games!

Head Start 4 students are learning about insects! They are learning the body parts, where do they live, what do they eat, who eats them and why they are important for the world.

In AM/PM the students are learning are: Ee and Yy. The students are also learning the numbers: 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and learning about solid shapes.

The Specialized students are learning the letters F and the letter O, and the numbers 1 and 2

Specialized students are learning about what is a community and the different places in the community. Such as post office, schools, churches, hospitals, houses, and restaurants among many places. Along with learning about different jobs people can do in a community. After this unit with the letter O, students will learn about Health and Nutrition, and why food, exercise, and being clean are important to be healthy.

Intensive students are learning about good manners with the book "Amira Has Manners" and fables like "The Little Red Hen". The letters the students will be exposed to this month are I, B, F and L. Students continue to learn how to transition from area to area, how to play functionally with toys and working on fine motor skills by learning to cut with scissors.



### The Kindergarten Superheroes Crew

Happy New Year! We are all so excited to be back from Winter Break and working like superheroes to get ready for First Grade! The children have matured so much since the beginning of the school year! We are seeing such growth in skills and independence!

Currently, in reading we are learning about technology at school and home. We discuss how technology helps make our lives easier and talk about how things were done differently "long ago" versus how they are done today. For example, transportation long ago relied on foot-power or travelling by horse and today we have cars, planes, trains, etc. Similarly, long ago people wrote with ink and quills, charcoal, and other materials. Today we have everything from pencils and pens to computer technology to help us write!

In phonics we are working on mastering letter sounds and how they blend to make words. You can help practice at home by breaking words into individual sounds and having them tell you the word (r-uh-n= run!)

During our math block we have been working on addition and subtraction with numbers up to 10. We will be moving into numbers 11-20 shortly. You can help your child develop their numeracy skills by having them count anything and everything! Cars, Cheerios, M&Ms, Legos, anything that has multiple pieces can be counted! We are also learning to WRITE the numbers, and this would be a great thing to practice at home!

On Wednesday February 8th we will be celebrating the 100th Day of School! We will be having fun with all things 100! 100 piece snacks, what 100 pieces are and students may dress up as if they are 100 years old

We are looking forward to an exciting second half of the school year! The best is yet to come!

## The 1st Grade Avengers

Happy New Year from First Grade!! We're excited to have two field trips planned for the second half of the school year. This month we're visiting Broward Center for the Performing Arts to see the "Lady Bug Action Hero" and in March we're visiting the Museum of Discovery and Science. We're in need of chaperones for the MODS field trip, please reach out to a first grade teacher or the office for more information to volunteer.

In ELA, we're focusing on Technology in the Workplace and how technology helps us in our every day lives.

In Math, we're focusing on Place Value and how numbers can be grouped in different ways. Please continue to assist your child with their homework and practice reading daily for at least 15 minutes.

## The Guardians of 2nd Grade

The end of the year is quickly approaching, and second grade has been working extremely hard!

In reading, we are learning about Point of view. The students are exploring stories told from different characters' points of view. The students are also learning about Author's Purpose.

In math, we are focusing on addition subtraction, and fractions. The students are learning different strategies to help solve these types of equations. Please help and encourage your child to PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE his/her addition and subtraction facts. The students can also practice building their fact fluency on a new math program called Reflex math.

In Writing, the students have been utilizing the writing process steps and focusing on the 6-traits of writing. We are currently working on expository writing.

In Science, we have become scientists investigating various scientific concepts. We are currently learning about the conservation of matter, properties of matter (solids, liquids, and gases and how they change), and temperature and its effects on physical properties.

In Social Studies, we are learning about consumers and producers.

<u>Homework! Homework!</u> The students are given homework daily, please make sure it is completed. Homework is a reflection of what we are doing in class, so it is very important for it to be complete

On January 25, 2023, the Second grade will be visiting the Broward Center for Performing Arts to see a play called "Lady Bug Hero". We are excited for our students to experience a live play.

# The Extraordinary League of 3rd Grade

Reading: The focus of our lessons throughout January will be Non-Fiction reading. In our study of nonfiction text, your child will be learning about text features, supporting details, charts, text structure, table of contents and words in context. We will also continue to work on identifying the problem and solution, making predictions, and retelling the story. As we are learning new reading skills, the children should be practicing at home through independent reading. Please continue to read every day with your child at home. Every bit of reading makes a difference.

Math: The focus of our lessons are adding and subtracting multi-digit whole numbers. Students are also working on solving multiplication and division problems.

State testing is in May, and we are dedicating instructional time to familiarize the students with the format and content of the test. We want to make sure our Third Graders have all the necessary tools when taking these challenging exams. Please know that the Third-Grade team understands the pressure your child may be feeling with so much work placed upon them. If you should have any concerns or questions, please know that we are here to help your child in any way we can.
