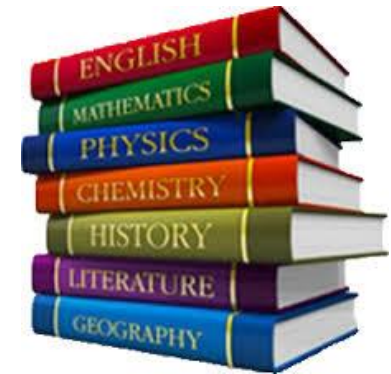

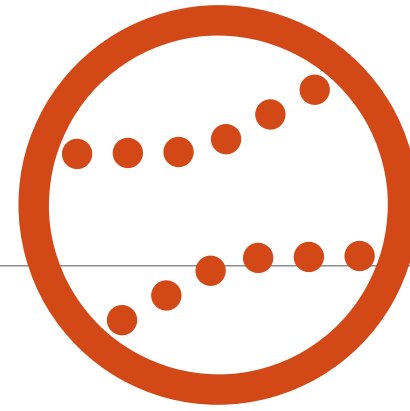

Ways to meet requirement:

1. 0.5 credit Personal Fitness & 0.5 credit Fitness Lifestyle Design (Take at MSD) **OR**
2. 2 years of JROTC **OR**

Note: .50 credit Personal Fitness AND .50 credit of PE (Band or Dance does not waive the requirement of .5 Personal Fitness).

Note: Dual Enrollment Physical Education courses will satisfy the Personal Fitness portion of this requirement

3. 2 years of a JV or Varsity sport

***1st Quarter + 2nd Quarter + Midterm Exam = Semester 1 Final Grade (GPA)**

***3rd Quarter + 4th Quarter + Final Exam = Semester 2 Final Grade (GPA)**

Example:

1st + 2nd + Midterm = Final Grade

A + B + A = A

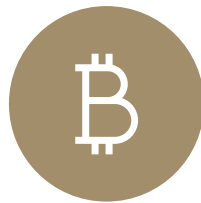

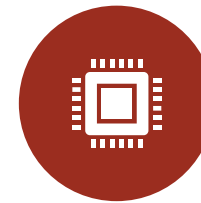
