Content Area Specialist Reports

Eligibility Recruitment Selection Enrollment and Attendance (ERSEA)

- The cumulative enrollment for Head Start Preschool (HSP) and Early Head Start (EHS) for March 2025 was two thousand and thirty-five (2,035).
- The 2025-2026 application window continued through March 21, 2025, at six locations spread out in the north, central, and south areas of Broward County. Application appointments were held in-person at these locations. Virtual Saturday options were also available for families.
- Internal and external marketing efforts continued for the 2025-2026 application period and were implemented through robocalls, text messages, and distribution of flyers within the community.
- Intake staff completed a total of seven hundred and four (704) applications for families applying in March for the 2025-2026 school year.
- During the month of February, Parent Educators completed thirty-two (32) interviews for families interested in Head Start for the 2024-2025 school year.
- The Data Management Specialist continued to process applications and placed eligible children in open seats for the 2024-2025 school year. Once applications were processed, parents were notified of their status via email.
- Accepted families were provided registration steps and a list of required documents needed for enrollment prior to their child attending school for the 2024-2025 school year. Parents completed school registration and Head Start enrollment forms online and uploaded the required documents into Child Plus using their individual upload link.
- The monthly attendance average for March 2025 was 86.54%. Attendance decreased by 1.0% due to the decrease in children attending school due to illnesses.

Health and Nutrition

- The Health Team continued to prepare health supplies for distribution to teachers.
- The Health Team continued to work with the Food & Nutrition Department and other school staff to identify the medical concerns of children, and to make sure dietary accommodation was in place as needed for newly accepted children.
- Parents were contacted to discuss dietary needs or accommodations for their child.
 Emails were sent to teachers and other pertinent school staff to notify them of medical concerns.
- Referrals for height and weight, hearing, and vision continued to be sent out to the



- pertinent parties (nutritionist, district audiologists, and parents).
- The Health Team Nurses continued preparing Care Plans for children as needed and shared with school staff, including teachers and school nurses.
- The EHS Nurse contacted parents regarding their child's health and nutrition concerns.
- Parents were contacted for updated health documents and the updated documents were uploaded into Child Plus.
- The EHS Nurse followed up with parents regarding children who had extended absences due to illness.
- The EHS Nurse updated children's health records and uploaded all records provided into Child Plus. Parents were encouraged to keep their children's dental records updated.
- Training was conducted for school staff by the EHS Nurse for seizures and food allergies.
- Emails were sent to children under 2 years of age for information regarding Shots by Two Program.
- EHS Nurse delivered supplies in the form of, but not limited to, diapers, wipes, water, and other items to the classroom for students.

Disabilities

- The Disabilities Team collaborated with Gulf Early Learning Center (GELC) HS Social Workers to prepare presentations for families of HS in the area of social skills and functions of behavior.
- The Disabilities Team participated in the 2025-2026 HS Application process with families in the community.
- The Disabilities Team reviewed signed consents and requested staffing dates.
- The Disabilities Team visited classrooms to provide interventions in the areas of language and behavior.
- The Disabilities Team attended staffings and Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) meetings.

Mental Health

- The Mental Health Team participated in Instructional Staff meetings and School Social Worker Collaborative meetings.
- The Mental Health Team completed classroom/site visits to assigned schools.
- The Mental Health Team provided mental health support to staff.
- The Mental Health Team participated in Collaborative Problem-Solving Team (CPST)/Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)/Response to Intervention (Rtl) meetings.



- The Mental Health Team provided Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA) support for all HSP educators and EHS CDAs by distributing materials to classroomsvisuals/questionnaires; support teachers with identifying classroom strategies to support areas of need/concern, entering DECA classroom scores in ChildPlus for educators awaiting access.
- The Mental Health Team collaborated with classroom staff to complete DECA assessments and enter scores ChildPlus for classrooms with daily substitutes.
- The Mental Health Team provided support to families/children through community resources and behavioral/mental health resources.
- The Mental Health Team planned and scheduled home visits for classrooms with daily substitutes.
- The Mental Health Team planned and scheduled social skills presentations with assigned schools.
- The Mental Health Team monitored attendance to comply with Head Start Performance Standards.
- The Mental Health Team completed referrals to Early Steps.
- The Mental Health Team participated in EHS screening reviews.

Parent Family and Community Engagement (PFCE)

- The Parent Educators continued taking applications for the 2024-2025 school year at their school sites.
- The Family Service Supervisor and Parent Educators continued to provide updated community resources to families.
- The Parent Educators continued distributing Head Start Flyers throughout the community and at community events.
- The Family Service Supervisor and Parent Educators met with Social Workers to prepare for the 2024-2025 parent curriculum training for Head Start parents.
- Head Start staff began to take applications for the 2025-2026 school year at Charles Drew Resource Center, Fairway Elementary, Gulfstream Early Learning Center, North Lauderdale Elementary, Thurgood Marshall Elementary, and Wingate Oaks.

Family Services

- The Parent Educators continued to connect with families through emails, phone calls, and meetings to provide individual support.
- The Parent Educators continued to assist parents with uploading the required application documents into Child Plus.
- The Family Service Supervisor continued reaching out to outside agencies to



provide additional social service support to Head Start families.

- The Parent Educators assisted parents with their family goals and family assessments.
- The Parent Educators began to contact their families regarding transition meetings for the 2025-2026 school year.
- The Parent Educators began to contact their families to follow up on family goals and family assessments.
- The Social Workers and Parent Educators conducted the second parent workshop.

Education

- Teacher Specialists completed Active Supervision Audits.
- Teacher Specialists completed spring Class Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) observations.
- Teacher Specialists coached Teachers in GOLD, collecting and documenting child data.
 - Teacher Specialists provided coaching support for lesson planning/unit study with teachers.
- Teacher Specialists collaborated with Disabilities team for MTSS/Eligibility Meetings.
- Teacher Specialists generated, analyzed and monitored the Education Report on ChildPlus.
