Florida Legislature 2024 Regular Session, Week 3 Report

OVERVIEW

The Legislature held Week 3 of the Regular Legislative Session.

The House and Senate each unveiled budget proposals for FY 2024-25. A highlight of the FEFP proposals can be found below.

All three Broward County Public Schools appropriation requests are fully funded within the Senate budget proposal:

- Student Athlete Mentoring Pilot Expansion \$250,000
- SmartPass Pilot Project \$300,000
- Adults with Disabilities (recurring) \$800,000

The House proposal only includes the Adults with Disabilities program.

The Senate and House Appropriations Committee are both slated to meet on Wednesday (January 31) to consider their respective proposals and will likely be considered on the Floor of each body the following week.

HB 917 - Career and Technical Education

Career and Technical Education: Provides exemption for minors to work in specified conditions; requires counties & municipalities to recognize certain persons as journeymen for specified occupations if such persons meet specified criteria; provides alternative to career fairs through other career & industry networking opportunities; revises provisions relating to revisions to state academic standards, requirements for certain credits & certifications to meet specified graduation requirements; requires DOE to convene workgroup by specified date for specified purposes; provides additional exemption from completing entry-level examination for certain students; creates Career & Technical Education Task Force adjunct to DOE. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 109 - Charter Schools

certain school district real property be designated as surplus; provides requirements for use of such surplus real property. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

(Identical to SB 46: Reading Achievement Initiative for Scholastic Excellence Program)

Authorizes tutoring to be provided after school day; & authorizes school districts that participate in specified tutoring program to provide stipend to instructional personnel & high school students serving as tutors for after-school tutoring.

Requires school districts to annually provide certain students in juvenile justice program with at least one opportunity to take high school equivalency examination at no cost to student.

Revises definition of term "economically disadvantaged" for purposes of school readiness program; & revises provisions relating to school readiness program.

HB 931: School Chaplains General Bill by McClain

(Similar to SB 1044: School Chaplains)

Authorizes school districts & charter schools to adopt policy to allow volunteer school chaplains; requires district school boards & charter school governing boards to assign specified duties to such volunteer school chaplains; requires volunteer school chaplains to meet certain background screening requirements; requires each district school board & charter school to vote by specified date on adoption of school chaplain policy.

Renaming "district advisory councils" & "school advisory councils" as "district community advisory boards" & "community advisory boards"; & revises requirements for such boards.

Increases maximum age of child victim of specified acts whose out of court statements may be admissible in certain circumstances; provides that first offense of specified sex trafficking offenses involving minors requires designation of defendant as sexual predator.
