



Legislative Affairs Department Broward County Public Schools Florida Legislature 2024 Regular Session, Week 7 Report

OVERVIEW

The Legislature held Week 7 of Regular Legislative Session.

Senator Collins and Florida State Legislators were joined by victims of communism from across the State to discuss the importance of instructing our youth about the dangers of communism in the United States. The event offered perspectives and first-hand experiences from victims of communist regimes across the world, and SB 1264's intended impact on education and public awareness.

Senate Appropriations Chair Senator Doug Broxson indicated it is not likely that members will begin budget conference this weekend.

This week there were no changes to the 2024-25 budgets passed last week in their respective chambers.

The Senate version allocates almost \$1 billion for educational improvements across the state in public K-12 schools, as well as colleges and universities.

The House also passed a bill for increased compensation for the governor and other state executives (beginning in fiscal year 2027-2028), while including a 3% cut from the state's total spending in the year before.

The House and Senate are proposing near-identical increases in per-student funding for kindergarten through 12th-grade students under the Florida Education Finance Program. Both proposals remain at a 2.5 percent hike. All three Broward County Public Schools appropriation requests remain fully funded within the Senate budget proposal:

- Student Athlete Mentoring Pilot Expansion \$250,000

- SmartPass Pilot Project \$300,000
- Adults with Disabilities (recurring) \$800,000

Retained on Calendar

Providing that an annual application for exemption on property used to house a charter school is not required; prohibiting members of the board of trustees of a Florida College System institution or a state university, respectively, from doing business with or having any business affiliation with any institution under their purview during their membership; authorizing private schools to use or purchase specified facilities; establishing the Purple Star School District Program; providing requirements for such program; requiring school districts and charter schools to provide certain students with an opportunity to take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery and consult with a military recruiter; prohibiting a public postsecondary institution from implicitly or explicitly prohibiting specified students from being employed, etc.

Revising a provision to authorize asthmatic students to carry a short-acting bronchodilator, rather than a metered dose inhaler; authorizing licensed pharmacists to dispense short-acting bronchodilators and components in the name of a public school; requiring certain public schools to adopt a protocol developed by a licensed physician for the administration of a short-acting bronchodilator and components by school personnel; authorizing certain students to carry a short-acting bronchodilator at school under certain conditions, etc.

Placed on Calendar, on 2nd reading

Changes name of "Tallahassee Community College" to "Tallahassee State College".

HB 511 - Graduate Program Admissions General Bill by Holcomb CoSponsors: Valdes CS Sponsors: Education & Employment Committee, Postsecondary Education & Workforce Subcommittee Placed on Calendar, on 2nd reading

Requires institution of higher education to waive certain examination requirements for servicemember who applies for admission to graduate program that requires such examination.

HB 537 - Student Achievement General Bill by Valdes CoSponsors: Garcia (A) CS Sponsors: Education & Employment Committee, Education Quality Subcommittee

Placed on Calendar, on 2nd reading

Removes provisions providing for award of certificate of completion to certain students; & creates Music-based Supplemental Content to Accelerate Learner Engagement & Success Pilot Program within DOE for specified purpose.

HB 553 - Career-themed Courses General Bill by Dunkley

Placed on Calendar, on 2nd reading

Revises requirements for specified school district strategic plan to include certain information; requires DOE to include specified data in annual review of K-12 & postsecondary career & technical education offerings; & requires school districts to inform students & parents of specified information during middle school course selection.

HB 767 - Resident Status for Tuition Purposes General Bill by Edmonds CoSponsors: Lopez (V), Valdes CS Sponsors: Postsecondary Education & Workforce Subcommittee

Placed on Calendar, on 2nd reading

Prohibits individual from losing his or her resident status for tuition purposes solely because of his or her incarceration.

HB 883 - Short-acting Bronchodilator Use in Public and Private Schools General Bill by Koster CoSponsors: Basabe CS Sponsors: Choice & Innovation Subcommittee, Health & Human Services Committee

Placed on Calendar, on 2nd reading

Authorizes certain public & private school students to carry short-acting bronchodilators & components; provides school district, public school, private school, and parental requirements.

Education Estimating Conference

Members met to discuss Public Schools PreK-12 Enrollment. 76 districts reviewed and approved their forecasts. 41 districts made changes to their initial forecast, 28 districts submitted discrete adjustments, and 26 districts showed a different averaging model. BCPS previously requested a shift of (101) Basic Non-ESE PK-3 to (111) Basic ESE PK-3. Initial FTE Enrollment Forecast
