

Keith Jones anchors the weekend edition of the NBC 6 South Florida News at 6 p.m. and 11 p.m. Jones grew up in the suburbs of Columbus, Ohio, but he's no stranger to South Florida, having earned a Bachelor's degree in Broadcast Communication/Journalism

from Barry University, where he attended on a baseball scholarship.

Most recently, Keith worked as the morning, 9 a.m. and noon anchor at WTSP in Tampa/St. Petersburg. His experience includes anchoring continuous coverage and reporting from the crash site of United Flight 93 on 9/11, field anchoring and reporting from the scene of nine trapped miners at Quecreek Mine in Pennsylvania, and reporting from plane crashes and prison breaks.

Ashley Jones is a former network news anchor for CBS News in New York. She was the anchor and executive producer of CBS MoneyWatch. Prior to that, she was an anchor, stocks editor and reporter for Bloomberg TV. Most recently, Ashley

was the morning news anchor in Miami for WSVN's "Today In Florida."

Prior to her career in broadcast television, Ashley worked in finance as a Series 6 and 63 licensed financial planner, specializing in estate tax planning.

A former NCAA, All-ACC, 4-year full scholarship tennis player at North Carolina State University, she was elected team captain during her junior and senior years and was awarded the state's "Mental Attitude and Sportmanship Award," which is voted on by peers and coaches. In January 2014, she was inducted into the first ever "Hall of Fame" at her former school, Columbus East High School.

Ashley and Keith Jones launched their own property investment company in 2016, Jones Group Properties. As busy philanthropists in the community, they host the fundraising events for St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital and the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society of South Florida. Their son, Jack is a sixth-grader at Falcon Cove Middle School. They live in Weston, Florida with their mini goldendoodle, Gatsby Weston.


PRINCIPAL OF THE YEAR AWARD




