

James F. Griffin, II

Principal, Boyd H. Anderson High School



James F. Griffin, II is a native of Fort Lauderdale, Florida. He graduated from Dillard High School in 1989, before matriculating to the home of the Wildcats, Bethune-Cookman University. At Bethune-Cookman, he earned dual degrees in Elementary Education and Specific Learning Disabilities. Mr. Griffin later attended Nova Southeastern University where he earned a Master's Degree in TESOL and a certificate in Educational Leadership.

Mr. Griffin joined Broward County Public Schools in 1993. He has taught grades K–5, as well as Adult Basic Education, General Education and English to second language learner adults from Haiti, Peru, Russia, Cuba, Brazil and China. He was appointed as an Assistant Principal at North Fork Elementary School in 2003. During his tenure at North Fork Elementary, Mr. Griffin was recognized as a 2007 finalist for Assistant Principal of the Year. Mr. Griffin received international recognition as an Elluminate Hero and Promethean Torchlight. He was appointed principal of

Rock Island Elementary School in 2007 and his accomplishments garnered him the esteemed privilege of being named Broward County's and Florida's Principal of the Year for 2010. He then went on to serve as the Principal of Lauderdale Lakes Middle School from 2010 until 2019. During his tenure at Lauderdale Lakes Middle School, Mr. Griffin was honored to serve as a member of the Florida Department of Education Commissioner's Superintendent Committee. Currently, he serves as Principal of Boyd H. Anderson High School.

Mr. Griffin is emerging as a global steward. He was invited by the Bahamian Ministry of Education to assist with the government's largest technology initiative in schools. He also funded the construction of a classroom through Free the Children in an underprivileged and underserved community in India. Some of Mr. Griffin's latest accolades and accomplishments include an honorary doctorate degree from Nova Southeastern University in 2022, graduating from the National Superintendent's Academy in 2019, an internship for Broward County's Public Information Office in 2018, induction into the Broward Education Hall of Fame in 2017, being honored by Legacy South Florida magazine as one of the "50 Most Powerful and Influential Leaders" of 2016, and being named a 2014 JM Lexus African American Achiever.

As President of PTSO, her strategy to engage families is simple: make parents feel welcome and comfortable on campus and help them to connect with one another to form a network of support for all families. She has created numerous events to bring families together, encouraging parents to build relationships with one another to support their students and South Broward High School. As president of PTSO, Ms. Mazor contributes to high-quality Instruction by funding classroom requests for supplemental programs and material, as well as promoting for tutoring and volunteering in the community. She is maintaining a strong presence on social media to announce upcoming events, share information about District initiatives and strengthen the communication between families and the school.

The Castro Family



The Castro Family has been very involved with the department of Equity, Diversity & School Climate and the schools their children attended. The Castro Family assists, organizes, volunteers and recruits other members of the community to attend substance and violence prevention events. The Castro Family has developed initiatives to bring more parents out during parent nights and school events. Ms. Dunia Castro has been very active in many schools PTSO/ PTSA holding the president position. She volunteers for field trips, field days and pro-social clubs such as SADD (Students Against Destructive Decisions), MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving), No Place for Hate, Choose Peace/Stop Violence, etc. The Castro Family's energy and enthusiasm are contagious and everyone wants to be near them. In addition, the Castro Family tries to pass on their love for giving back by always bringing others with them to participate and volunteer in school events.

MENTORING ACROSS BROWARD



Mentoring is nationally recognized as an effective intervention strategy and students who meet regularly with mentors are much more likely to be successful in school and beyond.

Mentoring Across Broward, which operates within the Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) Department of Equity, Diversity and School Climate, utilizes a multi-tiered approach to leverage school and community-based mentoring resources to better serve the needs of students.

The District's Community Involvement Awards provides an opportunity for schools to highlight their mentoring efforts by nominating a Mentor of the Year and Outstanding Mentoring Programs for consideration.

Mentoring Across Broward combines school-based mentoring, peer mentoring and community-based mentoring opportunities to ensure every student who can benefit from a mentoring relationship has access to a caring and supportive mentor whether in school or in the student's home community. In addition, BCPS is mobilizing District staff to serve as mentors to some of our most fragile students including those at risk of dropping out of school and students who are enrolled in Department of Juvenile Justice educational programs.

Among the school-based mentoring programs providing mentoring services, support and in some cases, scholarship opportunities are:

5000 Role Models

5000 Role models is a civic engagement program in which young males in elementary, middle and high school are paired with mentors from the community under the guidance and primary supervision of a school-based director. The site director, student and mentor focus on three general principles throughout the school year: progressive and successful men in the community to emulate; positive alternatives to self-destructive behaviors and societal pitfalls; everyone must assume responsibility for preparing our youth to successfully face the challenges and struggles in today's society.

Big Brothers - Big Sisters

Big Brothers Big Sisters - Bigs in Schools is a one-onone mentoring opportunity for adults and college students to meet with a child for one hour a week during school hours or during aftercare hours. Mentors may help with homework, play games, have fun and be a friend. Big Brothers Big Sisters also operates mentoring programs in select schools that target specific populations of students such as Mujeres Latinas at Indian Ridge Middle School, which pairs professional immigrant women with young girls with similar cultural backgrounds, as well as peer mentoring programs, in selected schools.

Latinos in Action

Latinos in Action is a part of the District's ongoing commitment to meeting the needs of Broward's growing Latino community. This program focuses on providing Latino students with increased opportunities for educational, service, cultural and leadership experiences, while empowering them to complete their high school education and attend a college or university after graduation.

MENTORING ACROSS BROWARD



Mental Health Association Listen to Children

Mental Health Association Listen to Children (LTC) mentoring program promotes mental health through active listening and prevention. LTC mentors serve as non-judgmental adult friends during weekly one-on-one meetings where they engage children through play and conversation. This program model helps enhance children's self-esteem, improve their communication skills and assist in teaching other skills such as decision-making and problem-solving.

Mentoring Tomorrow's Leaders

Mentoring Tomorrow's Leaders (MTL) is a peer-topeer mentoring and student leadership program that serves youth that are at-risk for not graduating and/or remaining in school. MTL aims to decrease dropout rates, particularly among minority males, to ensure successful school graduation based on the following five Pillars for Success: Academic Achievement, Mentoring, Family Involvement, Community Support and Student Incentives.

Take Stock in Children Mentor and Scholarship Program

Take Stock in Children's (TSIC) mission is to break the cycle of poverty for low income, academically qualified students by providing opportunities for post-secondary education. TSIC offers college scholarships to students who are matched with adult mentors who meet one-on-one with students in middle and high school. The mentors provide support and guidance to students further preparing them for academic and personal success.

Women of Tomorrow Mentor and Scholarship Program

Women of Tomorrow is about women helping women. The program model is unique and effective. Highly accomplished professional women meet with small groups of at-risk girls in public high schools once a month to discuss ways to overcome obstacles and provide skills for success. Participating students are encouraged to apply for scholarships provided through Women of Tomorrow.

Broward County Public Schools is committed to providing youth with access to quality mentoring programs, both in school and in the community.





Broward Estates Elementary School with Only the Beginning, Inc.

Only the Beginning, Inc. serves the Broward Estates Elementary School community faithfully with the goals of increasing student attendance and academic achievement, improving student behavior and parent involvement, boosting staff morale, increasing parent involvement, and connecting scholars and families to much needed resources. The Only the Beginning team visited Broward Estates Elementary and met with the school administration and other stakeholders, such as parents and community members, about challenges in the learning environment. They learned that the administrators were seeking a creative way to improve attendance and curve behaviors that distracted students from making gains. The solution – the "BEE" Incentivized Program.

The "BEE" Incentivized Program motivates students to consistently demonstrate an understanding of schoolwide expectations through positive classroom behavior, academic progress, daily attendance, and a daily display of good character. Students work hard to earn "BEE" bucks so that we can visit the game room or the school store! The school store is called "BEES R US" and has toys, games, DIY kits and trinkets from which the students can choose. Students are inspired to create, paint, inventory and organize the school store and game room which has board games, a pool table, basketball hoops, Play Station and Nintendo game consoles. There is also virtual reality and a cool "chill out" corner for anyone who just wants to read or relax.

The "BEE" Incentivized program has major benefits for both scholars and staff. It empowers staff to acknowledge and reward positive behavior, which motivates students to meet the expectations set by leadership, teachers and staff. The program also helps to improve overall school culture and atmosphere, as well as build positive habits such as being kind, reporting problems and working independently. Students are now eager to arrive to school on time, are encouraging each other to do their schoolwork and are motivated to help staff so that they can earn "BEE" bucks.

Only the Beginning, Inc. created a powerful program to empower Broward Estates Elementary students and motivate them to go to school and learn. On any given day, members of the Only the Beginning team can be found on the school campus interacting with the students and staff. The relationships they have built within the school community have lasting impacts on the Broward Estates Elementary School family.

SECONDARY LEVEL

Cypress Run Education Center with Learning for Success, Inc.

Learning for Success, Inc. is a multifaceted program that boasts various mini programs within. Cypress Run Education Center's middle school students have benefitted from the "My Future is Now" portion of the program, a program that builds character and focuses on career building. Students are exposed to occupations and afforded the opportunity to meet representatives and CEOs from various employment fields ranging from entertainment to business franchisees.

The high school population is connected to Solutions for Change. Solutions for Change's goal is to combat racism and create equity and social justice throughout the Broward County school system. Cypress Run Education Center houses approximately 170 expulsion students. However, the principal, Dr. Gastrid Harrigan and Mr. John Casbarro of Learning for Success, have worked to create and maintain opportunities that most students in an alternative setting would never get to experience.

Mr. Casbarro aligns the My Future is Now program field trips with the school's curriculum and chaperones each event. One of the most rewarding field trips was to the Miami Heat Arena. The students learned how each career at the Arena connects to create a safe and exciting environment. The students talked about the trip for weeks. Mr. Casbarro also orchestrated a hands-on presentation from the Broward School of Nursing. Students who had never thought about the medical field, left there planning to add Nursing to their list of career choices. Another presentation that was impactful was given by Publix associates. Students were ecstatic to learn of the stock options and age requirements needed to begin a lifelong career with a company of that caliber. With every presentation, a spark is lit in a student that may have struggled to find purpose.

Solutions for Change's focus on equality and justice for all students has been enlightening and emotional for Cypress Run's high school students. Mr. Casbarro's program has allowed the students to have a voice. Through creative writing competitions, students create a Social Justice piece, which some students shared at a city commission meeting.

Through these programs, Learning for Success shows Cypress Run Education Center students the ways that they can use their strengths, skills, talents and interests to reach their highest potential.

SECONDARY LEVEL

Seagull Alternative High School with My Safe Harbor, Inc.

My Safe Harbor, Inc. has been connected as a community partner with Seagull Alternative High School since 2012. The organization brings hope and encouragement by lending a helping hand to children and families in the community. "A child who is hungry cannot focus on learning and cannot function and thrive without proper sustenance and nutrition," says Marsha Tessler, the founder and Director of My Safe Harbor, Inc.

Over the past several years, My Safe Harbor, Inc. has provided food, snacks, water, juices, diapers, wipes and other baby supplies for the students and their families. For the past two years, they have provided over 40+ cans of 30–32-ounce size baby formula, 3-4 dozen jars of baby food, a dozen or more strollers, car seats, 2-3 dozen cases of diapers, wipes, pacifiers, baby bottles, sippy cups, and hundreds of bags of clothes and shoes for the children in the program. Teen parents can access the supplies as needed from a dedicated area in each childcare room.

In addition, Ms. Tessler offers her business to host Seagull Alternative High's annual toy drive and has provided toys and gifts for each child in the Child Development Center for the holidays. Another event, sponsored by My Safe Harbor, Inc., is the school's holiday party where gifts, snacks and beverages are distributed to more than 100 individuals. Lastly, My Safe Harbor, Inc. donates bags of clothes, shoes, toys, books, puzzles, stuffed animals and women's and men's clothing. During the summer when school is not in session, they continue to assist families with groceries and supplies. Seagull Alternative High School is grateful to Marsha Tessler and My Safe Harbor, Inc. for the long-standing partnership and dedication to its students and families.

The Superintendent may not allow resources to be allocated without firm evidence of their equitable distribution.

School Support

The Superintendent may not allow classrooms in C, D, F or Unsatisfactory rated schools to go without essential material and human resources.

Accountability

The Superintendent may not allow the District to operate without an accountability system for policy implementation that includes expectations, evaluation, transparency and continuous improvement.

Wellness Support

The Superintendent may not make decisions without ensuring students and staff are connected with necessary wellness resources.
