James F. Griffin, II

Principal, Boyd H. Anderson High School



James F. Griffin, II is a native of Fort Lauderdale, Florida. He graduated from Dillard High School in 1989, before matriculating to the home of the Wildcats, Bethune-Cookman University. At Bethune-Cookman, he earned dual degrees in Elementary Education and Specific Learning Disabilities. Mr. Griffin later attended Nova Southeastern University where he earned a Master's Degree in TESOL and a certificate in Educational Leadership.

Mr. Griffin joined Broward County Schools in 1993. He has taught grades K – 5, as well as Adult Basic Education, General Education and English to second language learner adults from Haiti, Peru, Russia, Cuba, Brazil and China. He was appointed as an Assistant Principal at North Fork Elementary School in 2003. During his tenure at North Fork Elementary, Mr. Griffin was recognized as a 2007 finalist for Assistant Principal of the Year. Mr. Griffin received international recognition as an Elluminate Hero and Promethean Torchlight. He was appointed principal

of Rock Island Elementary School in 2007 and his accomplishments garnered him the esteemed privilege of being named Broward County's and Florida's Principal of the Year for 2010. He then went on to serve as the Principal of Lauderdale Lakes Middle School from 2010 until 2019. During his tenure at Lauderdale Lakes Middle School, Mr. Griffin was honored to serve as a member of the Florida Department of Education Commissioner's Superintendent Committee. Currently, he serves as Principal of Boyd H. Anderson High School.

Mr. Griffin is emerging as a global steward. He was invited by the Bahamian Ministry of Education to assist with the government's largest technology initiative in schools. He also funded the construction of a classroom through Free the Children in an underprivileged and underserved community in India. Some of Mr. Griffin's latest accolades and accomplishments include an honorary doctorate degree from Nova Southeastern University in 2022, graduating from the National Superintendent's Academy in 2019, an internship for Broward County's Public Information Office in 2018, induction into the Broward Education Hall of Fame in 2017, being honored by Legacy South Florida magazine as one of the "50 Most Powerful and Influential Leaders" of 2016, and being named a 2014 JM Lexus African American Achiever. Most recently, Mr. Griffin was selected to participate in Florida Atlantic University's Doctoral program sponsored by the Teacher School Leader Federal grant program.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL LEVEL

Miami Marlins Foundation with Park Lakes Elementary School

The Miami Marlins and Miami Marlins Foundation teamed up with Kiwanis of Little Havana to provide over 10,000 students with school supplies in select Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach County elementary schools. This year, in partnership with FPL, the Marlins selected Park Lakes Elementary School for a unique in person school supplies distribution as the only school representing Broward County.

On August 22, 2024, each grade and classroom received free school supplies to help them "BAT" a thousand and write their own success stories! The Marlins and FPL provide over 25 volunteers in collaboration with the Office of Strategic Partnerships to set up and distribute over \$36,000 in school supplies to almost 1,000 elementary school students at Park Lakes Elementary School. Board Member Debra Hixon, Superintendent Hepburn, Billy the Marlin and executives from the Miami Marlins greeted and distributed the supplies to each student.



MIDDLE SCHOOL LEVEL

Harmony Development Center with James S. Rickards Middle School

Harmony Development Center's (HDC) partnership with James S. Rickards Middle School is a model of excellence. HDC provides Wraparound Academic Support providing free after-school and summer programs with certified teachers, serve 70 students, and offer counseling, housing support, and meals—meeting the needs of the whole child and their family. They also sponsor cultural events, making a lasting impact on students and families and student engagement. This partnership exemplifies what it means to support a Title I middle school through both academic enrichment and community uplift.



HIGH SCHOOL LEVEL

The Falcon Foundation with Charles W. Flanagan High School Zone

The partnership between Charles W. Flanagan High School Zone and the Falcon Foundation started in 2000 as "Get Flanagan A Stadium, Inc." This initiative raised awareness and funds for a stadium at Charles W. Flanagan High School. Joining with the City of Pembroke Pines, the organization raised over \$1.4 million for athletic facilities at Charles W. Flanagan High. The Foundation has evolved into the general support of Charles W. Flanagan High and its eight-feeder elementary and middle schools. The Foundation is led by Henry Rose, whose commitment spans decades, influencing thousands of students and staff.

Vashti Chinkoo McArthur High School

Throughout her academic tenure at McArthur High School, Vashti Chinkoo has been a part of several organizations including Broward College TRiO Upward Bound; AICE Leadership; Best Buddies; SPIDER College Preparatory Program; and Rotary InterACT Club.

Currently the president of the National Honor Society, Ms. Chinkoo has committed more than 4,400 service learning hours to volunteer work and giving back to her South Florida community. At McArthur High, she helps at several events, including senior events, fundraisers, and school spirit activities. Ms. Chinkoo works with two local elementary schools to ensure that students have the necessary equipment to fuel their learning. This includes updating laptops, sorting books in the library, and tutoring. She also serves the community each week at Griffin Road Church of Christ. Ms. Chinkoo volunteers as a Sunday School teacher and nursery aide. Additionally, she volunteers for Hand 'N' Hand Youth Project, a nonprofit organization that donates school supplies for students in need; and Southwest Focal Point Community Center, assisting in any means for the events they hold for the senior citizens in the community.

Born and raised in Guyana, Vashti Chinkoo is a first-generation student who will be attending Florida International University in the summer. She is an early admissions student through Broward College and will be receiving her AICE Diploma along with her high school diploma.

The Greater Fort Lauderdale Diaper Bank

Led by Dwayne and Brittany Wolfe, The Greater Fort Lauderdale Diaper Bank has become a vital force in supporting families across the community. Through broad-based outreach and rapid response initiatives, the organization meets critical needs with dignity and urgency. In partnership with the Family and Community Engagement (FACE) North Team at Broward County Public Schools, they extend that impact directly into the lives of teenaged parents within our District, helping build pathways toward stability and success.

The Diaper Bank eases financial burdens that can force young parents to choose between school and caregiving by supplying essential childcare resources. With an average impact of \$600 per student in covered expenses, their support significantly boosts school attendance, retention, and overall academic achievement. The Greater Fort Lauderdale Diaper Bank exemplifies authentic community partnership. Their steadfast commitment goes beyond material assistance, it restores hope and stability for students navigating extraordinary challenges. Their model sets a powerful standard for holistic, responsive engagement in education and empowers teenaged parents to pursue their education with dignity, support, and the knowledge that their community believes in them.

Jessica Oliverio Bailey

As Riverglades Elementary School's PTA Vice President of Events, Jessica Bailey has transformed school events into inclusive, educational, and community-centered experiences. By deeply involving students in event planning, such as turning Creative Arts Night into a school-wide, student-led installation themed on environmental sustainability, she bridges classroom learning with real-world impact. Ms. Bailey fosters strong partnerships with teachers and community organizations, supports over 1,000 volunteer opportunities (including high school students), and ensures accessibility through low-sensory hours. Her strategic, inclusive approach promotes high-quality instruction, a safe and supportive environment, and effective communication, positioning Riverglades Elementary School as a model for family and community engagement Districtwide.

MENTORING ACROSS BROWARD





Mentoring is nationally recognized as an effective intervention strategy and students who meet regularly with mentors are much more likely to be successful in school and beyond.

Mentoring Across Broward, which operates within the Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) Department of Equity, Diversity and School Climate, utilizes a multi-tiered approach to leverage school and community-based mentoring resources to better serve the needs of students.

The District's Community Involvement Awards provides an opportunity for schools to highlight their mentoring efforts by nominating a Mentor of the Year and Outstanding Mentoring Programs for consideration.

Mentoring Across Broward combines school-based mentoring, peer mentoring and community-based mentoring opportunities to ensure every student who can benefit from a mentoring relationship has access to a caring and supportive mentor whether in school or in the student's home community. In addition, BCPS is mobilizing district staff to serve as mentors to some of our most fragile students including those at risk of dropping out of school and students who are enrolled in Department of Juvenile Justice educational programs.

Among the school-based mentoring programs providing mentoring services, support and in some cases, scholarship opportunities are:

5000 Role Models

5000 Role models is a civic engagement program in which young males in elementary, middle, and high school are paired with mentors from the community under the guidance and primary supervision of a school-based director. The site director, student, and mentor focus on three general principles throughout the school year: progressive and successful men in the community to emulate; positive alternatives to self-destructive behaviors and societal pitfalls; everyone must assume responsibility for preparing our youth to successfully face the challenges and struggles in today's society.

Big Brothers Big Sisters

Big Brothers Big Sisters - Bigs in Schools is a one-onone mentoring opportunity for adults and college students to meet with a child for one hour a week during school hours or during aftercare hours. Mentors may help with homework, play games, have fun, and be a friend. Big Brothers Big Sisters also operates mentoring programs in select schools that target specific populations of students such as Mujeres Latinas at Indian Ridge Middle school,

which pairs professional immigrant women with young girls with similar cultural backgrounds as well as peer mentoring programs in selected schools.

Latinos in Action

Latinos in Action is a part of the District's ongoing commitment to meet the needs of Broward's growing Latino community. This program focuses on providing Latino students with increased opportunities for educational, service, cultural and leadership experiences, while empowering them to complete their high school education and attend a college or university after graduation.

Mentoring Tomorrow's Leaders

Mentoring Tomorrow's Leaders (MTL) is a peer-topeer mentoring and student leadership program that serves youth that are at-risk for not graduating and/or remaining in school. MTL aims to decrease dropout rates, particularly among minority males, to ensure successful school graduation based on the following five Pillars for Success: Academic Achievement, Mentoring, Family Involvement, Community Support and Student Incentives.


Take Stock in Children Mentor and Scholarship Program

Take Stock in Children's mission is to break the cycle of poverty for low income, academically qualified students by providing opportunities for post-secondary education. TSIC offers college scholarships to students who are matched with adult mentors who meet one-on-one with students in middle and high school. The mentors provide support and guidance to students further preparing them for academic and personal success.

Women of Tomorrow Mentor and Scholarship Program

Women of Tomorrow is about women helping women. The program model is unique and effective. Highly accomplished professional women meet with small groups of at-risk girls in public high schools once a month to discuss ways to overcome obstacles and provide skills for success. Participating students are encouraged to apply for scholarships provided through Women of Tomorrow.

The Big Brothers Big Sisters of Broward County

The Big Brothers Big Sisters of Broward County BBBS has served as an external partner for 51 years, proudly supporting and providing programs for Broward County Public Schools elementary-post-secondary students in a variety of settings. To date, 854 mentors have completed 40,992 combined service hours in BCPS schools.

Description of BBBS Programs:

The **BIG Futures** program (Ages 12-25) is a college and career readiness initiative designed to equip youth for post-secondary success through career mentoring, education, and access to key opportunities. Youth in the BIG Futures program are mentored in the professional work environments of our corporate partners. Youth learn valuable career development skills through job shadowing with the employees and they are given college readiness tools.

The **BISS program** supports academically at-risk youth by pairing them with caring mentors, either adult or high school Bigs—who help improve their academic performance, school attendance, and classroom behavior. Bigs provide encouragement and guidance, fostering a positive outlook on education and inspiring Littles to graduate and pursue higher education or career opportunities.

The **BIG Pride** program is a focused effort to address the unique needs and vulnerabilities of LGBTQ+ youth (Ages 12-25) by providing trusting, caring, mentoring relationships between Bigs and Littles.

The **Mentoring Children of Promise** program (Ages 5-25): Mentoring Children of Promise (MCOP) provides consistent, one-to-one mentoring for youth impacted by parental or familial incarceration. BBBS Broward partners with custodial or legal guardians to ensure these children receive the support, guidance, and encouragement they need to overcome challenges, build resilience, and achieve their full potential.

Liberty Elementary School / Mentoring Program: BI-WI (Because I'm Worth It)

The "Because I'm Worth It" Mentoring Program aims to empower 25 young girls at Liberty Elementary by providing them with positive role models and guidance for personal growth, academic achievement, and future success. Through this program, the girls learn to recognize their inherent worth, build self-confidence, and develop the skills they need to excel in both school and life. Each mentee is paired with a dedicated mentor who offers support, encouragement, and valuable life lessons. Regular mentorship sessions allow the girls to set goals, overcome challenges, and unlock their potential in a nurturing environment.

The program focuses on several key objectives. First, it aims to help the girls build self-worth and confidence, encouraging them to believe in themselves and their abilities. It also provides guidance on academic and personal development, including goal-setting, study habits, and building positive relationships with peers and teachers.

Mentors work with the girls to help them set short-term and long-term goals, both academically and personally, and inspire them to dream big for their futures. Additionally, the program creates a supportive community where the girls can share their experiences, ask questions, and learn from one another while building lasting friendships. The program's emphasis on providing positive female role models empowers the girls, helping them envision themselves as future leaders and change-makers.

Leadership Through Literacy Connections



Riverglades Elementary School / Mentoring Program: Canine Assisted Therapy

Canine Assisted Therapy (C.A.T.) is a nonprofit organization in Fort Lauderdale, Florida dedicated to improving the lives of those in need. C.A.T. works with volunteers and their dogs to provide animal assisted therapy and companionship to people in hospitals, nursing homes, assisted living facilities, hospice, and schools. From children's reading programs to working with veterans, C.A.T. has expanded its services to help people from all walks of life. C.A.T. provides Riverglades Elementary School students comfort, where their youngest readers build confidence by reading

to the therapy dogs through their Leashes for Literacy program.

Leashes for Literacy is designed to help children gain confidence and achieve academic goals in the classroom, one on one or small group visits with a therapy dog provides struggling students a safe space to practice reading skills with the support from a non-judgmental canine. All of Riverglades Elementary's PreK, ASD cluster students, and Kindergarten students bring books and poetry notebooks and read to the dogs. This helps with comfort, reading fluency and building confidence.

Additionally, the program aligns with the district's commitment to equity and closing the achievement gap by providing targeted support to students who may benefit from additional reading intervention. By creating a safe and engaging learning environment, this initiative reinforces district goals related to academic

Behaviorally, students have shown increased respect for authority figures and stronger social-emotional skills, fostering a more positive school climate. Additionally, the program has strengthened community relations by building trust between students, families, and law enforcement. This initiative has also encouraged parent engagement, as families appreciate the support their children receive both academically and socially.

Ramblewood Middle School / Mentoring Program: Dads Be on Duty/ 5000 Role Models

Mr. Major Collins has been working with the students of Ramblewood Middle School since 2021. His Dads Be On Duty mentoring program specifically targets eighth-grade males with the goals of increasing attendance, reducing suspensions, improving self-esteem, grades and life skills, as well as preparing them for high school and beyond.

Mr. Collins also works with students about making better choices in both academic and social settings particularly outside the school campus. Sharing life experiences with these students has been crucial to the mentor program to deter students from

external suspensions at Ramblewood Middle School. Through this program, the young males mentees are recognizing their mistake and writing apology letters and making strides to change their trajectory not only at Ramblewood Middle School but beyond. The young men are encouraged to share their struggles in the "Monday Group Huddles" and together build bond of respect and develop strategies how to solve peer issues.
