Technology Advisory Committee December 14, 2020 Meeting Notes

1. **Call to Order** – Beth Anne Carr, TAC Chair - This is an informal meeting as we did not have enough of a quorum to attend in person for a formal meeting.

2. Business before the Committee

a. Dark Fiber/WAN project update (Vince Vinueza) – Site surveys are done. We are getting to the permitting phase where the carrier can bring in the fiber from the streets into the classrooms. This spring we will be migrating schools over to this faster connectivity. Goal is to complete by next summer. Everything is on target.

Background: Three years ago, we started an initiative where the schools and our sites are connected by cabling that is supported by AT&T (WAN) for a fee. The program is supported by e-Rate. Four years ago, the FCC allowed for Dark Fiber where the school district will own the cabling, for a cost, but can go up to higher speeds because you are paying for carrying and connecting the cabling, but not the bandwidth.

How does this project tie into the problems we are having with TEAMS? The problems we are having with TEAMS is not always a bandwidth issue. Problems could be because of MS issues or saturation issues where the student(s) lives.

This project will help with the Internet connectivity in our building providing much faster bandwidth speeds.

LAN – Local Area Network – within the campus itself WAN – Wide Area Network – what connects the campuses

b. IT Service Management (Matthew Bradford) – Over the next year we are looking to standardize our policy and procedures as to how we are helping our users, obtain a new incident management ticketing system, and determine how we will utilize the data to direct the department. Will have more processes and procedures than what the department has had before.

How is it going with the IT Help Desk with teachers calling in? Have teachers been using it?

We have been maturing in our processes with the Support Desk. Protocol is for teachers to contact the school's micro tech and then the micro tech will contact the IT Help Desk.

 c. Polycom Studio USB Video Bar (Maximo Rosario) All cameras have been deployed to the secondary schools. Additional training and support is being given to teachers through weekly webinars. To view videos on the use of the cameras in the classroom go to <u>browardschools.com/Page/57040</u>.

ESE and self-contained classrooms will be amongst those receiving cameras. It is up to the teacher as to whether they want to use the camera in their classroom.

d. Canvas/TEAMS platform update (Daryl Diamond/Vincent Vinueza) End of first semester might be changed to January 12th and this end date will be made in Canvas. The Board needs to agree to that tomorrow. We are currently in Ring 4 in TEAMS out of the unstable early release ring. This will bring us more stability and reliability.

What are we doing with Microsoft to ensure that the issues with TEAMS are solved? Academics and IT meet with Microsoft weekly. We are setting up a chatbot for teachers to be able to access to solve issues immediately. We are tightening up our communication to report issues with TEAMS and other products. We are also working on delivering professional development to help teachers learn how to use TEAMS and other technologies more effectively.
