





## Broward Estates Elementary Potential Merger With Dr. MLK

- Combine Broward Estates Elementary and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Montessori so that all 116 in-boundary students attend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Montessori
- All 116 In-Boundary Broward Estates students within 2 Miles of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Montessori campus.
- Combine existing Broward Estates
   Elementary STEM Museum Magnet
   program with STEM Museum program at
   Plantation Elementary
- Create early learning center on current Broward Estates Elementary campus with community programming









### Broward Estates Elementary Enrollment and Capacity Usage

- Prekindergarten Classes = 0








## Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Enrollment and Capacity Usage

- Prekindergarten Classes = 5








## Broward Estates Elementary Site Plan

## **Boundary Considerations**

#### **Redefining** Our Schools

Consideration	
Impact on Enrollment	Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (MLK)current enrollment= 468 students/ 72.3% capacity usage; proposal would result in enrollment of 584 students/ 90.3% usage
Impact on Feeder Patterns	No impact; both Broward Estates and MLK have 100% feeder pattern to Parkway Middle and Dillard 6-12
Impact on Neighborhood Integrity	Improves neighborhood integrity: Broward Estates and St. George communities are currently split between Broward Estates and MLK; proposal assigns whole neighborhood to MLK
Impact on Distance to School	Entire Broward Estates boundary is within 2 miles of MLK campus and; no students who can currently walk to Broward Estates will have to ride a bus
Impact on School Diversity	Both schools share similar demographics: Broward Est.: White 5.0%, Black 92.3%, Hispanic 7.7%, FRL 97.3% MLK: White 5.3%, Black 93.8%, Hispanic 6.0%, FRL 94.0%
Impact on Students with Special Needs	Broward Estates: 26 ESE students, no ESE special programs MLK: 68 ESE students, 1 ESE special program
