





roward County Public Schools is the eighth largest school district in the nation, and the second largest in Florida. The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) has accredited every school and every center in the school district—making Broward's public school statict—in the United States. Each school or center meets more than 70 rigorous standards set by SACS.

Nearly 128,300 students (K-12) and more than 125,000 adults are offered educational programs at 98 elementary schools, 26 middle schools, 21 high schools, 3 area vocational centers, 2 adult centers, 8 exceptional student centers, 2 adult centers, 8 exceptional student centers, 2 adult centers, 8 exceptional student centers, 2 afternative centers, and 18 acmmunity schools. Over 13,500 permanent employees work to make the day-to-day operation of the school district a continued success. The school district is the largest employer in Broward County.

The school district operates as a county system without regard to individual city limits. However, the system is divided into three areas, with an area superintendent responsible for each area. It is the responsibility of the area superintendents to provide principals, teachers, and students in their area with the necessary leadership to support schoolbased programs which carry out the publicles of the School Board. This structure allows the school district to be more responsive to local community needs.



On the county level, the major central services are divided into four divisions. Instruction/Program Services; Government, Community and Employee Relations; Human Resource Management and Development; and Business/Support Services.

The School Board of Broward County, Roidd is a seven-member board with each member sexing a four-year term. The Superintendent of Schools is appointed by the School Board. The Board meets regularly on the first and third Thursday of each month at 10:00 a.m. in the Board Room of the Administration Building, 1320 Southwest Eouth Street, Fort Lauderdale, Proido. It also holds conference sessions every Tuesday at 10:00 a.m.
