



roward County Public Schools is the eighth largest school district in the nation, and the second largest in Florida. The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) has acceedited every school and every center in the school district—making Broward's public schools the largest fully accredited school ofistrict in the United States. Each school or center meets mose than 70 rigorous standards set by SACS.

Nearly 128,300 students (K-12) and more than 145,000 adults are offered educational programs at 98 elementary schools, 26 middle schools, 21 high schools, 3 area vocational centers, 2 adult centers, 3 area vocational centers, 2 adult centers, 8 area vocational student centers, 2 alternative centers, and 18 community schools. Over 13,500 permanent employees work to make the day-to-day operation of the school district a continued success. The school district is the largest employer in Broward County.

The school district operates as a county system without regard to individual offy limits. However, the system is divided into three areas, with an area superintendent responsible for each area superintendent responsible for each area superintendents to provide principals, teachers, and students in their area with the necessary leadentship to support schoolbased programs which camy out the policies of the School Board. This structure allows the school district to be more responsive to local community needs.



On the county level, the major central services are divided into faur divisions: firstruction/Program Services; Government, Community and Employee Relations; Human Resource Management and Development; and Business/Support Services.

The School Board of Broward County, Florida is a seven-member board with each member serving a four-year ferm. The Superintendent of Schools is appointed by the School Board. The Board meets regularly on the fitst and third Thursday of each month at 10:00 a.m. in the Board Room of the Administration Building, 13:20 Southwest Fourth Street, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, it also holds conference sessions every Luesday at 10:00 a.m.
