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

necessary leadership to support school based programs which carry out the policies of the School Board. All area superintendents report to the Deputy Superintendent. This structure allows the school district to be more responsive to local community needs.

On the county level, the administrative functions Personnel, Policies, Government & Community Relations; Training & Development; Business & Support Services; and Facilities, Property are divided into five divisions: Instruction; Management and Maintenance. The School Board of Broward County, Florida is a seven member board with each member serving a four year term. The Superintendent The Board meets regularly on the first and third besday of each month at 10:00 a.m. in the Administration Center, 600 Southeast Third Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Conference of Schools is appointed by the School Board. Board Room of the Kathleen C. Wright sessions are held on alternate Tuesdays.

## Public School Enrollment:

Fable 15-1 lists the Broward County total public school enrollment for the 1987/88 school year through the 1992/93 school year. Over this period, total enrollment increased by 43,325 students. Most of the increase has resulted rom growth in the elementary grades Kindergarten through 5th grade.

### School Facilities:

In 1987, the School Board adopted a five year capital improvement plan for construction of new school facilities and for the renovation and remodeling of existing schools and facilities. Funding for the plan was insured with the passage of a \$317 million dollar bond issue on June 16, 1987. The plan included site acquisition for and construction of twelve (12) new elementary schools; two (2) new middle schools and a high school. Additionally, almost all existing schools have been or will be renovated or remodeled. Additional capacity will be added to many schools.

In July 1989, the capital plan was updated to include five (5) additional new elementary schools and a new middle school. The plan update included renovation projects, replacement schools, asbestos abatement, and high school science renovations. The total additional funding required for the plan update was \$229,700,000. The School Board has approved the sale of Certificates of Participation (COP's) to help fund the additional capital needs.

At the end of 1992, twelve new elementary schools have been constructed and opened; three elementary schools are under construction and are anticipated to open in the 1993/94 school year. Four new middle schools are in operation and a new high school was opened in 1990. Additionally, many schools have been renovated and updated and replacement schools have been completed. District staff is currently formulating the next five year capital plan.

## Exceptional Student Education:

The Exceptional Student Education program provides comprehensive educational programs for all handicapped and gifted students. Exceptional Student programs

include services to students certified as Educable Mentally Handicapped, Trainable Mentally Handicapped, Profoundly Mentally Handicapped, Specific Learning Disabled, Emotionally Handicapped, Speech and Language Impaired, Autistic Deaf, Hard of Hearing, Partially Sighted, Blind, Physically Handicapped, Hospital, Homebound, and Gifted. Ranked among the most comprehensive and progressive in the United States, approximately 24,000 students benefit from these programs.

The following recent changes have been implemented in Exceptional Education programs:

- The Parent Education Network has been training parents of exceptional students.
- The Exceptional Student Education staff and parents have jointly developed a Parent Primer which tells parents of exceptional students about their rights and responsibilities.
- Special Education is now provided to all handicapped three and four year old children.
- Family counselors provide services to elementary and middle school emotionally handicapped children and their families.
- A program for identifying gifted students from under-represented groups is being piloted.
- Two new centers for severely emotionally disturbed children have been built. The programs integrate mental health services with education.

## Vocational and Technology Education (VTE):

Vocational and Technology Education (VTE) programs cover virtually every career field in

Agribusiness and Natural Resources Education, Business Education, Health Occupations Education, Home Economics Education, Industrial Education, Marketing and Diversified Education, Public Service Education and Technology Education. These programs are on the cutting edge, constantly evolving to keep pace with changes in technology.

Over 60 different occupational programs are taught providing training for careers that include nursery worker, bookkeeper, nursing assistant, child care aide, bank teller, travel agent, engineer, auto body technician and corrections officer.

The Academy of Finance and the Academy of Travel and Tourism, partnerships between the district, the National Academy Foundation and local business, are offered at ten area high schools. The Academies offer rigorous, two-year multi-disciplinary programs that prepare the students for a career, in either finance or travel and tourism.

More than 145,000 full and part-time students are enrolled in vocational education courses in 30 middle schools, 22 high schools and three full time centers. Atlantic Vocational Center, William T. McFatter Vocational-Technical Center and Sheridan Vocational-Technical Center. Courses are also offered at 25 community schools and numerous off-campus sites throughout the county, such as hospitals, industry sites and correctional facilities.

Taught by highly trained instructors using state-of-the art equipment, students who complete Broward's programs enter the

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workforce with the most up-to-date skills needed to succeed in today's competitive environment. In addition, more than 67 advisory committees comprised of industry professionals make invaluable curriculum recommendations.

Industry Services Training is a specialized VTE program designed to serve local business, industry and government by providing a cost effective means to train employees to meet current and future labor needs.

Additionally, courses are provided to update technical skills to meet industry standards and requests. Some examples are: Master Cam and Smart Cam softwares for improved precision machining, Computer Aided Design (CAD) courses, Child Care Services Program, Coder Specialist Program and Instrumentation Technician for Health Occupations and a skills lab located at Sheridan Vocational-Technical Center.

Another project under the department's responsibility is TECH PREP, which provides a coordinated, sequenced program of academic and technical courses that starts in the ninth grade and leads to the completion of a two-year certificate or Associate of Science Degree program.

Broward County has received national recognition for numerous innovative programs, such as Ford Automotive Student Services Training Program (ASSET), General Motors Service Technology Training Program, the Centers for Electronic Emphasis, an apprenticeship program and Auto Body Technical (ATT) which leads to an Associate of Arts Degree.

## Adult and Community Education

Adult and Community Education is the largest instructional area of the School Board. Instruction is provided to over 337,000 residents of Broward County, Florida. Adult Education covers instruction in basic skills (literacy, English as a second language, high school completion, and GED Preparation). Community Education provides instruction and services which address unique community needs.

Special programs and services are designed to address the unique needs of handicapped adults, minorities, the homeless, Project Independence clients, Eligible Legalized Aliens, parents, inmates in correctional facilities, the elderly and senior learners. Extremise cooperative agreements and partnerships with community based organizations, business, industry, churches, and governmental agencies exist to insure educational and support services.

The age range for participants is birth through the nineties. Broward County utilizes 21 schools as Community Schools thus, enabling maximum utilization of facilities between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. Adult General Education instruction is also available through six (6) comprehensive centers for adults (including three (3) vocational centers). Instruction is also available for adults at off-campus locations throughout Broward County. These sites include malls, shopping centers, housing complexes, congregate living facilities, churches, libraries and community

### Student Services:

To meet the challenge of educating students in a modern day urban society, Broward has developed a comprehensive program of student services. The program includes

Broward Advisors for Continuing Education, Career Education, Evaluation and Testing, Family Counseling, Guidance and Counseling, Health Education Services, Jobs Network, Prevention Programs, Psychological Services, School Social Welfare and Attendance, and Volunteer Services. The departments provide coordination of curriculum and support services to schools so that they may implement programs which assist students, school staff and families of the students.

students in achieving their goals. Through joint funding by the Broward County Commission, Student Services provides family counseling at Student Services plays an integral part in assessing student academic, psychological and social strengths and weaknesses, communication and learning skills, aptitudes and interests. A comprehensive guidance curriculum helps students with career and post-secondary educational planning, with social and personal development and building self-esteem. The health curriculum addresses HIV/AIDS education, nutrition, human sexuality, drug education, gun safety and other aspects of nealthy development. Peer counseling and other prevention programs further assist no cost to families in various school sites hroughout the district. School volunteers provide additional assistance to teachers and students in all schools.

### Special Programs

The Special Programs Department provides educational support programs for more than sixty thousand (60,000) educationally and economically disadvantaged children in the Broward County School district. These programs include Dropout Prevention, Chapter 1 Basic/Migrant, Performance Improvement Program (PIP), Home Instruction Program for Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) and Indian Education.

## Dropout Prevention

The Dropout Prevention Program is an organized system of instruction and services designed to address the educational and personal needs of identified students whose school success requires specific support and services. Structured support and services are provided to students in the traditional school setting, in alternative schools/centers and in specified HRS facilities. These programs include students who are unmotivated or disinterested, teen parents, disruptive or delinquent students and others who need programs that address substance

### Chapter I Basic

Chapter I Basic provides financial assistance through state educational agencies to local educational agencies to meet the special needs of educationally deprived children in school attendance areas with concentrations of children from low income families, as well as children in location institutions for the neglected or delinquent.

## Chapter I Migrant

The Migrant Education program is a federally funded compensatory program designed to provide for the unmet needs of the children of migratory workers and fishermen who are enrolled within the public schools in the district.

## Performance Improvement Program (PIP)

The Performance Program is designed to improve achievement and to help students enhance their self-concepts, improve behavior and have a positive attitude toward school.

## Home Instruction Program for Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY)

HIPPY is an educational program for disadvantaged children and their parents. Through weekly contact with a home visitor, parents are provided skills needed to teach

their children at home, using structured educational materials.

### Indian Education

The Indian Education program helps low-achieving Indian students overcome academic skills deficiencies

## Magnet and Open Boundary Schools:

Magnet schools are centered around a specialized curriculum such as music, science, pre-engineering, performing arts, foreign language, or computer/high technology. These schools are designed to attract and motivate students as they encourage voluntary desegregation.

Magnet programs are programs which have a unique course of study and open or extended boundaries. They may be open to students only in a particular area or open to all students in the County. Transportation is provided for students residing more than two miles from the school. The current magnet schools include:

## HIGH SCHOOLS:

Science/Pre-Engineering Programs - Ely High School This program is a rigorous four year course of study for students who plan to continue their education in the fields of Engineering, Science and Technology. Students participate in state, national and international competitions.

The four year International Studies program focuses on a study of cultures through language, art, music, economics and political science. Working in cooperation with Florida International University, students attend speakers' series and cultural events as well as interact with University faculty and students.

Performing Arts - Dillard High School
The Performing Arts Program offers training in

dance, voice, instrumental and electronic music and other performing arts areas. Students also take coursework in stagecraft and costume design. Performances in the community complement the students regular performing schedule.

Computer/High Technology - Dillard High School - This program integrates curriculum and technology. Students will explore technological uses of equipment in basic curriculum and in business, drafting, performing arts and other specialized areas.

International Baccalaureate - Boyd Anderson High School This is a two year course of study leading to examinations for the Baccalaureate diploma. This program is designed to educate the whole person through a rigorous liberal arts curriculum which includes a community service requirement. The pre-International Baccalaureate program offered in grades 9 and 10 will prepare students for the actual coursework requirements of the International Baccalaureate program.

## MIDDLE SCHOOLS:

Performing Arts - Parkway Middle School
The Parkway Performing Arts Program parallels the Dillard Program. The program encompasses a wide variety of music, art, dance, drama, and technical arts offerings. Highly interested and motivated sixth to eighth grade students are invited to interview for the program.

Computer/High Technology - Parkway Middle School The use of computers and technologically advanced equipment to aid the learner in the educational process is the focus of this program. Allowing students to progress at their own rate and monitor their progress will attract students with diverse educational needs. The role of the teacher as imparter of knowledge will change to that

of coach and facilitator.

Both Science/Pre-Engineering and International Studies are offered in each geographic area, at McNicol Middle (south area); Everglades Middle (central area); and Crystal Lake Middle (north area).

Science/Pre-Engineering The curriculum focuses on a study of the South Florida environment through extensive field and laboratory experience. Guest speakers, high tech equipment and a specialized curriculum are offered.

International Studies This program develops an understanding of the world through language, art, music and cultural studies. Spanish and French, as well as Foreign Language Humanities will be offered.

## ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS:

Performing Arts - Walker, Bethune, Deerfield Park and North Andrews Gardens Elementary Schools: In addition to the students' basic academic education, training in art, music, drama and dance is offered. Kindergarten through fifth grade students are eligible for elementary performing arts programs.

Science, Malhematics and Technology: Colber, Broward Estates, and Charles Drew Elementary Schooks: Science labs, mathematics labs and computers in the classroom are parts of this exciting hands-on instructional program for elementary students. Science and mathematics specialists introduce students to the wonders of science and the applications of mathematics, allowing students to explore their environment in the learning process.

### Vova Schools:

The nationally recognized Nova schools - Nova Eisenhower, Nova Blanche Forman, Nova Middle, and Nova High School - offer varying

programs. Students throughout the county may apply for admission to these schools. Parents should contact the Nova Office at 765-6046 for information.

## Exemplary Programs:

The district's strategic five-year plan, Focus: 2000, encompasses eight district-wide goals that have been designed to coincide with other state and national education initiatives. The district's goals for 1991-96 have been developed through a participatory process involving school, home and business. Each school and department has developed as one-year plan for addressing district goals. School Improvement Teams (ST) have been developed at each school. These teams are addressing ways to achieve the goals.

An adopt-a-school program, Partners In Excellence has matched 162 schools and 15 programs with 152 different businesses in the community. These partnerships facilitate the achievement of district and community goals.

Computers - Broward County's student to computer ratio ranks first among the 50 largest school districts in the nation with a student/computer ratio of 10:1. The Association of Educational Data Systems has named Broward as one of the top ten school district leaders in computer education in the nation.

Homework Houline is the district's outreach effort, a homework assistance program which was established in 1984. More than 100,000 calls have been answered in every curriculum area. Each Wednesday, math related questions are answered on live television through the ITV Homework Hotline, a game show style assistance program. There are also fifteen walk-in homework centers located throughout the County.

New teaching methods are used in district pilot programs. The Nova Elementary, Middle and High Schools are among only 24 schools accepted into the Coalition of Essential Schools -a nationally recognized program developed by Dr. Theodore Sizer of Brown University. Coalition programs help students learn by strengthening critical thinking skills.

The Saurday Screening Program serves Kindergarten students entering public school for the first time. Health screening teams provide parents with diagnostic screening services for children in the area of health and education. Over 6000 students attend the Saturday Screening Program each year.

A Drug/Alcohol Education and Prevention Program was recognized by the Governor's Commission on Substance Abuse as the most outstanding school based program in Florida. The program was also recognized by the U.S. Office of Education as a model prevention/early intervention program. Every student (K-12) in the school system is exposed to course material through a comprehensive, sequentially developed curriculum. "Just Say No" and Students Against Driving Drunk (SADD) clubs are established at almost every school. The district is also involved in a "Just Say No" program countywide and a Red Ribbon Week each October.

A Peer Counseling Program serves as a model for the U.S. Office of Education and has been cited as "The Outstanding Preventive Program" by the National Schools Resource Network. This program, which teaches students how to help themselves by helping others, is the largest full-time program in the state and nation.

Innovative Curriculum, an inservice training seminar on a newly developed curriculum about the Holocaust was sponsored for secondary social studies teachers. The curriculum assists staff in teaching this significant part of history. This curriculum is the first of its kind in the

nation. The middle school child receives even extra support. A teaming approach to instruction helps students continue to build self esteem while making a positive transition to a broader range of experiences.

## Community Support

More than 16,000 parent and other adult volunteers work with students in the schools. Every school and area, as well as the district itself, has an advisory council including parents, other citizens, teachers and students. The School Board has established a link with the County of High School Student Councils and consults regularly with student leaders.

## Volunteers Assisting Students and Teachers (VAST)

They offer assistance by tutoring, helping with enrichment activities, performing clerical duties and assisting with special school-wide projects. In addition to these core volunteer activities, VAST coordinates and implements the following special school volunteer programs in the schools:

LISTEN TO CHILDREN - extends the effectiveness of the guidance counselor by providing trained volunteers to listen to children who are having interpersonal problems. Cosponsored with the Mental Health Association, the Listener program focuses on grades 1-5.


MEET THE MASTERS - is an art appreciation program utilizing volunteer presenters. The trained volunteers present two related art prints every six weeks to K-5 classes. The volunteers highlight the artists' backgrounds and lead the students to discover the different styles, techniques and media used by the artists. Meet the Masters is currently being implemented in 30 elementary schools.


SENIOR MENTORS FOR CREATIVE STUDENTS -pairs creative and outstanding senior citizens with creative and talented students who have a similar interest. Mentors and students work together on special enrichment projects. Annually funded by a grant from Chevron USA and the Florida Department of Education, the Senior Mentor Program focuses on grades 2-11.

SUPERSTARS - designed for students who need challenge and motivation for solving work and logic problems. This enrichment program is designed to be managed by a school volunteer and supported by administrators and classroom teachers. Originated by the Florida Department of Education. SUPERSTARS focuses on grades 1-5.

CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT - Broward County encourages citizen involvement at the school, area and district level as well as to provide input to county staff and program coordinators in developing curriculum. PTA and PTO also assist at the school and throughout the district.
