


2003-2004 ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BOUNDARIES

SUMMARY OF INTENDED ACTION:**

It is proposed that:

**E-1: Coconut Palm Elementary to Elementary School “Y”
Number of students: 747**

Establish the boundary for Elementary School “Y.” Adjust the boundary of Coconut Palm Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Elementary School “Y” for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of Interstate 75 and SW 148 Avenue extended, south along SW 148 Avenue to Miramar Parkway, east along Miramar Parkway to Red Road, south along Red Road to the Broward/Miami-Dade County line, west along the Broward/Miami-Dade County line to Interstate 75 and north along Interstate 75 to SW 148 Avenue extended.

**E-2: Hollywood Central Elementary to Colbert Elementary School
Number of students: 132**

Adjust the boundary of Hollywood Central Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Colbert Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of South Dixie Highway and Washington Street, east along Washington Street to Federal Highway, south along Federal Highway to Pembroke Road, west along Pembroke Road to South Dixie Highway and north along South Dixie Highway to Washington Street.

Recommence at the intersection of NW 9 Avenue and Pembroke Road, east along Pembroke Road to North Dixie Highway, south along North Dixie Highway to NW 7 Street, west along NW 7 Street to Foster Road, northwest along Foster Road to NW 9 Avenue and north along NW 9 Avenue to Pembroke Road. For more information on former starburst island areas refer to the Superintendent’s Memorandum Regarding the 2004/2005 School Attendance Areas/Boundaries and School Usage Recommendations, Former Starburst Attendance Islands.

E-3: Riverland Elementary to North Fork Elementary School
Number of students: 44

Adjust the boundary for Riverland Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend North Fork Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of NW 27 Avenue and NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard, east along NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard to Interstate 95, south along Interstate 95 to Broward Boulevard, west along Broward Boulevard to NW 27 Avenue and north along NW 27 Avenue to NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard.

E-4: Harbordale Elementary to North Fork Elementary School
Number of students: 21

Adjust the boundary for Harbordale Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend North Fork Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of NW 15 Terrace and NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard, east along NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard to NW 14 Way, south along NW 14 Way to NW 4 Street, west along NW 4 Street to NW 15 Terrace and north along NW 15 Terrace to NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard.

Recommence at the intersection of NW 14 Avenue and NW 4 Street, east along NW 4 Street to NW 12 Avenue, south along NW 12 Avenue to NW 2 Street, west along NW 2 Street to NW 14 Avenue and north along NW 14 Avenue to NW 4 Street. For more information on former starburst island areas refer to the Superintendent's Memorandum Regarding the 2004/2005 School Attendance Areas/Boundaries and School Usage Recommendations, Former Starburst Attendance Islands.

E-5: Harbordale Elementary to Sunland Park Elementary School
Number of students: 10

Adjust the boundary for Harbordale Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Sunland Park Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of NW 15 Terrace and NW 7 Street, east along NW 7 Street to NW 12 Avenue, south along NW 12 Avenue to NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard, west along NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard to NW 15 Terrace and north along NW 15 Terrace to NW 7 Street. For more information on former starburst island areas refer to the Superintendent's Memorandum Regarding the 2004/2005 School Attendance Areas/Boundaries and School Usage Recommendations, Former Starburst Attendance Islands.

E-6: Harbordale Elementary to Walker Elementary School
Number of students: 22

Adjust the boundary for Harbordale Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Walker Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of NW 14 Way and NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard, east along NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard to NW 12 Avenue, south along NW 12 Avenue to NW 4 Street, west along NW 4 Street to NW 14 Way and north along NW 14 Way to NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard. For more information on former starburst island areas refer to the Superintendent's Memorandum Regarding the 2004/2005 School Attendance Areas/Boundaries and School Usage Recommendations, Former Starburst Attendance Islands.

E-7: Floranada Elementary to Sunland Park Elementary School
Number of students: 9

Adjust the boundary for Floranada Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Sunland Park Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of NW 10 Terrace and Sunrise Boulevard, east along Sunrise Boulevard to NW 9 Avenue, south along NW 9 Ave to NW 8 Street, west along NW 8 Street to NW 10 Terrace and north along NW 10 Terrace to Sunrise Boulevard. For more information on former starburst island areas refer to the Superintendent's Memorandum Regarding the 2004/2005 School Attendance Areas/Boundaries and School Usage Recommendations, Former Starburst Attendance Islands.

E-8: Walker Elementary to Sunland Park Elementary School
Number of students: 65

Adjust the boundary for Walker Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Sunland Park Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of NW 10 Terrace and NW 8 Street, east along NW 8 Street to NW 7 Avenue, south along NW 7 Avenue to NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard, west along NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard to NW 12 Avenue, north along NW 12 Avenue to NW 7 Street, east along NW 7 Street to NW 10 Terrace and north along NW 10 Terrace to NW 8 Street.

E-9: Return Sunland Park Elementary 6th Grade to William Dandy Middle School
Number of students: 32

Return to elementary/middle school grade configuration. Sixth grade students within the 2003/2004 Sunland Park Elementary School attendance area attend William Dandy Middle School.

E-10: Floranada Elementary to North Side Elementary School
Number of students: 25

Adjust the boundary for Floranada Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend North Side Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of NW 9 Avenue and Sunrise Boulevard, east along Sunrise Boulevard to Flagler Drive, southwest along Flagler Drive to NE/NW 8 Street, west along NE/NW 8 Street to NW 9 Avenue and north along NW 9 Avenue to Sunrise Boulevard. For more information on former starburst island areas refer to the Superintendent's Memorandum Regarding the 2004/2005 School Attendance Areas/Boundaries and School Usage Recommendations, Former Starburst Attendance Islands.

E-11: Walker Elementary to North Side Elementary School
Number of students: 94

Adjust the boundary for Walker Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend North Side Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of NW 7 Avenue and NW/NE 8 Street, east along NW/NE 8 Street to Flagler Drive, northeast along Flagler Drive to Sunrise Boulevard, east along Sunrise Boulevard to NE 15 Avenue, south along NE 15 Avenue to NE 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard, west along NE 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard to NW 7 Avenue and north along NW 7 Avenue to NW/NE 8 Street.

E-12: North Side Elementary to Thurgood Marshall Elementary School
Number of students: 44

Adjust the boundary for North Side Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Thurgood Marshall Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of Andrews Avenue and NE 16 Street, east along NE 16 Street to NE 4 Avenue, south along NE 4 Avenue to NE 13 Street, west along NE 13 Street to Andrews Avenue and north along Andrews Avenue to NE 16 Street.

E-13: Griffin Elementary to Hawkes Bluff Elementary School
Number of students: 2

Eliminate 50 Choice Seats reserved at Griffin Elementary School for elementary students residing in the Hawkes Bluff Elementary School attendance area for the 2004/2005 school year.

E-14: Liberty Elementary to Margate Elementary School
Number of students: 3

Eliminate 100 Choice Seats reserved at Liberty Elementary School for elementary students residing in the Margate Elementary School attendance area for the 2004/2005 school year.

E-15: Country Hills/Eagle Ridge Elementary to Eagle Ridge Elementary School
Number of students: 3

Return to elementary/middle school grade configuration. Adjust the shared boundaries for Country Hills/Eagle Ridge Elementary Schools so that Eagle Ridge Elementary School becomes a K-5 grade configuration. Sixth grade students within the 2003/2004 Eagle Ridge Elementary School attendance area attend Coral Springs Middle School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of the Sawgrass Expressway and the canal just west of NW 109 Lane, south along the canal west of NW 109 Lane to the canal west of NW 110 Avenue, south along the canal west of NW 110 Avenue to the canal west of NW 107 Avenue extended, south along the canal west of NW 107 Avenue extended to Wiles Road, west along Wiles Road to the Sawgrass Expressway and north, northeast along the Sawgrass Expressway to the canal just west of NW 109 Lane.

E-16: Country Hills/Eagle Ridge Elementary to Country Hills Elementary School
Number of students: 324

Return to elementary/middle school grade configuration. Adjust the shared boundaries for Country Hills/Eagle Ridge Elementary School so that Country Hills Elementary School becomes a K-5 grade configuration. Sixth grade students within the 2003/2004 Country Hills Elementary School attendance area attend Coral Springs Middle School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of the Sawgrass Expressway and the canal just west of NW 109 Lane, east along the Sawgrass Expressway to University Drive, south along University Drive to Wiles Road, west along Wiles Road to the canal west of NW 107 Avenue extended, north along the canal west of NW 107 Avenue extended to the canal west of NW 110 Avenue, north along the canal west of NW 110 Avenue to the canal west of NW 109 Lane and north along the canal west of NW 109 Lane to the Sawgrass Expressway.

E-17: Parkside Elementary to Country Hills Elementary School
Number of students: 195

Adjust the boundary for Parkside Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Country Hills Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of Coral Springs Drive and Wiles Road, east along Wiles Road to University Drive, south along University Drive to Sample Road, west along Sample Road to Coral Springs Drive and north along Coral Springs Drive to Wiles Road.

E-18: Lauderhill Paul Turner Elementary to Endeavour Primary Learning Center
Number of students: 119

Adjust the boundary for Lauderhill Paul Turner Elementary School so that kindergarten through third grade students attend Endeavour Primary Learning Center for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of the canal west of NW 55 Avenue and Oakland Park Boulevard, west along Oakland Park Boulevard to Florida's Turnpike, south along Florida's Turnpike to NW 22 Street extended, west along NW 22 Street extended to the canal west of NW 55 Avenue and north along the canal west of NW 55 Avenue to Oakland Park Boulevard.

E-19: Lauderdale Paul Turner Elementary to Royal Palm Elementary School

Number of students: 36

Adjust the boundary for Lauderdale Paul Turner Elementary School so that fourth through fifth grade students attend Royal Palm Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of the canal west of NW 55 Avenue and Oakland Park Boulevard, west along Oakland Park Boulevard to Florida's Turnpike, south along Florida's Turnpike to NW 22 Street extended, west along NW 22 Street extended to the canal west of NW 55 Avenue and north along the canal west of NW 55 Avenue to Oakland Park Boulevard.

E-20: Cresthaven Elementary to Sanders Park Elementary School

Number of students: 15

Adjust the boundary for Cresthaven Elementary School so that kindergarten through fifth grade students attend Sanders Park Elementary School for the 2004/2005 school year.

Commence at the intersection of the CSX Railroad and NW 13 Street extended, east along NW 13 Street extended to NW 6 Avenue, south along NW 6 Avenue to the Blanche Ely High School property line, south along the Blanche Ely High School property line to NW 10 Street, east along NW 10 Street to NW 7 Avenue extended, south along NW 7 Avenue extended to NW 6 Street, east along NW 6 Street to the FEC Railroad, south along the FEC Railroad to the Pompano canal, west along the Pompano canal to the CSX Railroad and north along the CSX Railroad to NW 13 Street extended. E-21: McNab Elementary to Sanders Park Elementary School

Commence at the intersection of NW 6 Avenue and the railroad spur, east along the railroad spur to NW 3 Avenue, south along NW 3 Avenue to NW 10 Street, west along NW 10 Street to NW 4 Avenue, south along NW 4 Avenue to NW 10 Street, west along NW 10 Street to the Blanche Ely High School property line, north along the Blanche Ely High School property line to the east boundary along the Blanche Ely High School property line, east along the Blanche Ely High School property line to

NW 6 Avenue and north along NW 6 Avenue to the railroad spur. For more information on former starburst island areas refer to the Superintendent's Memorandum Regarding the 2004/2005 School Attendance Areas/Boundaries and School Usage Recommendations, Former Starburst Attendance Islands.

E-22: Sheridan Hills Elementary to Oakridge Elementary School
Number of students: 12









 REALLOCATION – SCHOOL YEAR 2004-2005**

During the fiscal year of 2004-2005, we are estimating a move of approximately 100 portable classrooms. In addition, there will be portable moves needed to satisfy district objectives for annexes and temporary housing of new school populations. The average cost per portable classroom is \$41,500. This cost includes: plan preparation, portable moving, foundation and pier preparation, hook-up of life-safety systems and plumbing, installation of stairs and ramps, and to repair/replace items to meet the Florida Building Code requirements.
