## What is the Boundary Process?

- Florida statutes 1001.41 and 1001.42 give School Boards the power and duty of assigning students to schools
- To equitably serve our large student population while complying with local policy Inter-local Agreement (ILA) which is a requirement for financial viability in the District's 5-year capital plan (DEFP) and state mandated Class Size Reduction it is necessary to review schools' geographic attendance areas on an annual basis for potential changes
- During this review communities have several opportunities to provide input on all school attendance areas through conversations that consider community values and data (e.g. student population projections) to balance enrollment at our schools
- The process concludes when the School Board votes to adopt the school boundaries for the following school year (2020/21)



## Review of the 2019/20 Boundary Process

- DSA presented the 2019/2020 Boundary Process and timeline at a School Board Workshop May 15, 2018. Direction was given by the Board to have SAF's nominate representatives and alternates for the School Boundary Committee (SBC), and have IZone principal facilitators choose members. Additional reps would be chosen for any school impacted by a proposed change.
- DSA received 1 community boundary change proposal to move a portion of the South Broward High School boundary to Hollywood Hills High School.
- At a School Board Workshop on October 23, 2018, Board consensus was not to move forward with the proposal received.
- October 25, 2018 Superintendent Runcie issued a memorandum recommending no boundary changes for 2019/20, and therefore no need to convene SBC. SBC public meeting and deliberation meeting both canceled.




## Last Year's School Boundary Process IZone Boundary Committee

- Process used since 2014/15
- A Committee representing each of the 28 IZones, nominated by SAF's and selected by IZone principal facilitators, votes on school boundary proposals to make recommendations to the School Board

Pros	Cons	2
1. Allows community boundary concerns to be addressed	1. Can cause unnecessary conflict between communities	
2. Facilitates community/ staff collaboration	2. May encourage potentially unreasonable proposals	
	3. Inhibits long-range comprehensive planning	
	4. Lack of participation from committee members when there is no proposals impacting their zone

## **Monitor School Enrollment**

### Continue to watch enrollment through best practices

- 1. Communicate with any school approaching capacity
- 2. Conduct review of all programs at identified schools approaching capacity
- Limit new reassignments and phase-out reassignments at schools approaching capacity
- 4. Perform on-site capacity usage analysis through school walk-through
- Consider other SB Policy 5000 Options, such as school-within-a-school, co-teaching, floating teachers, etc.
- 6. Student address verification, government database review, and potential use of private investigator



## Alternate Opportunities in SB Policy 5000

- Alternate calendar
- Grade reconfiguration
- School-within-a-School (FS 1003.02 (4)) including floating teachers, co-teaching, reorg of groups of students
- Enrollment capping
- Choice seats
- Portable movement



## **Under-Enrolled Schools/Potential Building Space**

SB Policy 5000 Defines Under-Enrollment as School Utilization below 70% Of Permanent Capacity.

In 2018/19, there are 30 schools enrolled below 70% permanent capacity and 7 schools enrolled below 55% permanent capacity






# PreK-8 Option 1 for 2020/21: Bethune Elementary and Attucks Middle






## PreK-8 Option 2 for 2020/21: Driftwood **Elementary** and Driftwood Middle
