SUBJECT: SCHOOL-BY-SCHOOL FIVE-YEAR STUDENT ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS FOR

THE 2019/20 THROUGH 2023/24 SCHOOL YEARS

Each year, following the benchmark day enrollment count, the Demographics & Student Assignments Department forecasts student enrollment for the upcoming five years for both District innovative and charter schools. These five-year enrollment projections are the basis for utilization planning for all District educational facilities, including evaluating school attendance areas for compliance with local and state enrollment mandates, and identifying available space for various types of school choice programs. Following initial publication in the fall, enrollment projections are updated in the spring to incorporate anticipated student movement due to school boundary changes adopted by the School Board through the annual community school boundary process.

To forecast enrollment at District innovative schools, the Demographics & Student Assignments Department uses a geographically-based cohort survival model, similar to the one used by the Florida Department of Education (FLDOE) for its enrollment projections and by the U.S. Census Bureau for its population projections. A baseline kindergarten group, or cohort, is first calculated based on birth data obtained from The Bureau of Vital Statistics. The model then uses an "aging" concept that moves the cohort of students into the future and increases or decreases their numbers by attrition rates calculated from the three previous years' enrollment trends by grade. The resulting projection is then modified to reflect the impact of confounding variables such as trends in residential development, students' school choice options, the opening and closing of charter schools, and natural disasters which can cause sudden changes in student enrollment.



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As shown in Table 1 below, a trend of slight growth in District innovative school enrollment is forecasted for all levels through 2023/24. Overall enrollment in kindergarten through twelfth grade is anticipated to increase by 1,257 students by the end of the five-year period, with an increase of 623 students at the elementary level and 17 students for middle schools. High school enrollment is also forecasted to increase, with a projected gain of 616 students. Enrollment in prekindergarten and center schools, as well as at schools without assigned attendance areas, is not projected, but rather remains constant with the current year's enrollment carried out over the upcoming five years, as these schools have controlled enrollment.

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Table 2 shows a comparison of the actual 2018/19 benchmark day enrollment with the projected enrollment for 2019/20. At the middle and high school levels there is expected to be slight enrollment growth, with an increase of 14 and 259 students, respectively. Elementary school enrollment is forecasted to experience a drop in enrollment of 361 students. Overall, enrollment at District innovative schools in kindergarten through twelfth grades is projected to decrease slightly from 2018/19 to 2019/20, with a decrease of 0.04%, or 88 students.

For charter schools, which open and close unpredictably, frequently change locations, and lack assigned attendance areas, a geographically-based cohort projection model is not applicable. In order to accurately represent the impact of charter schools on District innovative school enrollment, a different model is required. The Demographics & Student Assignments Department employs a method which identifies the historic trend in the proportion of charter school enrollment to total District enrollment, and carries that trend out over the five-year projection period to back-calculate anticipated charter school enrollment from projected District innovative school enrollment. The resulting charter school enrollment projection is then distributed by elementary, middle and high school levels in their entirety, but is not disaggregated for individual schools. Table 3 below shows the five-year historic and projected five-year student enrollment for charter schools at the elementary, middle and high school levels.





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As with District innovative schools, charter schools are expected to follow the trend of recent years for the projection period. Total enrollment at charter schools is projected to increase by 1,602 students over the next five years to 47,521 students. These additional students entering charter schools may be students who are new to Broward County, those who are currently home-schooled or who attend private schools, as well as a significant portion who attend District innovative schools. This may, consequently, further impact enrollment at District innovative schools, but this impact cannot be predicted for new charter schools that currently do not exist. Table 4 shows the trend of charter schools opening and closing over the last five years.

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Historically, the cohort survival method used to project the total District innovative school enrollment has been extremely accurate, with an error of less than +/- 1% of actual student enrollment. This year's actual benchmark day enrollment for prekindergarten through twelfth grade, reported at 220,184, was only 1,293 students lower than the projected enrollment of 221,477, an error of 0.6%. Table 5 below shows a comparison of last year's enrollment projections compared to the benchmark day enrollment for the 2018/19 school year.

The Demographics & Student Assignments Department enrollment projections differ from school budget projections produced by the Budget Office. School budget forecasts are one-year projections used to allocate funding to schools for the next school year based on the Full Time Equivalency (FTE) conducted every year in October. In this FLDOE-required calculation system, students may be partially or fully counted, or even counted more than once, based on their program, school, or grade level. By contrast, the Demographics & Student Assignments Department five-year enrollment projections are based on the count of actual whole students on the benchmark day of school and are used for long-range facility planning, as well as next-year seat allotment for school choice programs. Furthermore, school boundary planning requires extensive community involvement and thus early identification of any schools potentially not meeting class size and/or school concurrency mandates is critical. Since the final FTE calculation is not provided to the District until the latter part of November, there would be insufficient time to plan school attendance areas for the upcoming year based on FTE.
