SUBJECT: FLORIDA SCHOOL GRADES, BASED ON 2021-2022 ASSESSMENT DATA

This memorandum summarizes the school grade results released today by the Florida Department of Education at the school, district and state levels. School year 2020-2021 did not report school grades for all schools, as stated in DOE Order No 2021-EO-02. Schools must have tested at least 95% to receive a school grade in 2021-2022. The Florida Department of Education released additional school grades following the annual investigation and appeal period. This memorandum has been updated to reflect data that have changed resulting from the additional release.

## Highlights:

Broward maintained its District grade of "B" and is within one percentage point of an "A"

When comparing school grades between 2018-2019 and 2021-2022

- 45% 43% of our traditional schools remained an "A" or improved to an "A"
- 55% 53% of our traditional schools remained an "A" or "B" or improved to an "A" or "B"
- 79% 80% of our traditional schools remained an "A", "B", or "C" or improved to an "A", "B", or "C"
- Broward has a higher percent of schools earning a grade of "A" or "B" than the state average

## Review of the 2022 school grades revealed the following:

- One hundred and four eight of Broward's schools earned an "A" grade in 2021-2022
  - Sixty-six eight of Broward's traditional schools earned an "A" grade in 2021-2022
- Seventy-four of Broward's schools earned an "B" grade in 2021-2022
  - Fifty-two five of Broward's traditional schools earned an "B" grade in 2021-2022
- Eighty-six Ninety-eight of Broward's schools earned an "C" grade in 2021-2022
  - Seventy Eighty of Broward's traditional schools earned an "C" grade in 2021-2022
- NineTen of Broward's schools earned an "D" grade in 2021-2022
  - Seven of Broward's traditional schools earned an "D" grade in 2021-2022
- Three of Broward's schools earned an "F" grade in 2021-2022
  - o Two of Broward's traditional schools earned an "F" grade in 2021-2022

The 2021-2022 school grades, with charter schools, were computed following the rules adopted by the Florida Board of Education at its January 17, 2018 meeting.
