National Mass Violence Center

- Cooperative agreement with OVC, US Department of Justice
- Duration: October I, 2017 September 30, 2020

Mission: To improve the nation's capacity to serve victims of mass violence through research, planning, training, technology, and collaboration



History Between MUSC and Broward County

- ▶ 2013 2016: Trained 2 different cohorts + TF-CBT Booster
 - **250** professionals across multiple agencies
 - 343 children and teens were identified
 - 182 completed the full TF-CBT treatment protocol
- May 2018: Response to Parkland shooting
 - TF-CBT Booster, involving 86 participants from community-based agencies across Broward County (Partnership with NMVC/NCTSN)

Goals

- Implement and use TF-CBT with students in Broward County Public Schools
- Ensure that children, youth and their families who need TF-CBT receive it
- Identify and overcome barriers to youth engaging in and completing TF-CBT
- Promote trauma-informed schools
- Monitor progress in achieving these goals, and
- Sustain the use of TF-CBT over time after the learning collaborative is completed.

Broward County Public Schools CBLC Timeline



Benefits of Participation

- Intensive training and case consultation from nationally approved trainers
- Clinicians become highly clinically trained in the use of the most well-supported treatment approach for traumatized children and their families, TF-CBT.
- Brokers become highly trained in understanding TF-CBT, trauma screening and referral criteria
- Emphasis on building collaboration to enhance outcomes for children and teens
- Clinicians will met nearly all training and consultation call requirements for national certification in TF-CBT.

TF-CBT National Certification

- 2 day in-person training by approved national trainer
- At least 9 of 12 consultation calls
- At least 3 completed cases with full protocol, including pre and post assessment
- Involvement of caregiver
- ► Knowledge Quiz 80%
- **\$250** for 5 years
