Special Project (100 Points max.)

2019-20 Theme: Story Map of Your School Environmental Initiatives

Add your school's environmental initiatives to the district's story map using the link below. A story map is an interactive map that tells a story using images and text. Contribute to the story map by uploading your pictures with descriptions at: <http://bit.ly/P3Category6>

In your online application, under the narrative section, briefly describe your contributions to our story map – what is it we're going to see.

- Be sure to have media releases on file in your school for anyone featured in your story map.

For maximum points:

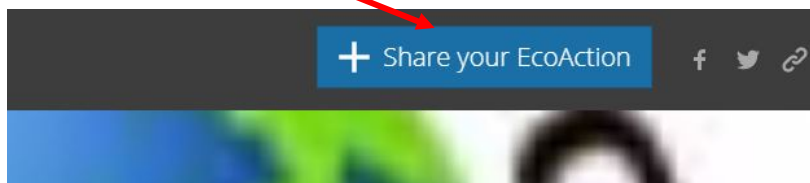
- The story map is clear and easy to follow, i.e. the picture and the description are easy to understand.
- The story map clearly shows the different school initiatives.
- The story map shows different areas of the school including outside learning areas, such as the gardens, and inside such classroom activities.
- The school environmental initiatives incorporate interdisciplinary learning – for example, STEM plus social studies (civic engagement).
- The school environmental initiatives provide all types of student engagement.

Instructions on How to Upload your Pictures to the Story Map

1. Take pictures of whatever you'd like to upload. If you're uploading via your browser in your computer, make sure that your pictures are accessible – i.e. if you took the pictures via your phone, send them to yourself and save them to your computer. You can upload pictures up to the closing of the online application on April 3, 2020.
2. Write up a description of what the picture shows. Make it brief.
3. Write down your school address. Your school address is the one we use to tag your pictures as your submission for Category VI.
4. Once you have these, follow the instructions below on how to upload.
5. **NOTES:** You can't edit your picture once you upload it. You can upload pictures one at a time until the close of the online application time – April 3, 2020. **Be judicious on the picture and the number of pictures you upload – you want them to be coherent to show a story map of the environmental initiatives of your school. See rubric from the previous page.**

A. How to Upload Via Your Browser in Your Computer:

1. Go to <http://bit.ly/P3Category6>
2. When the page loads, click **+Share your EcoAction** – upper right hand corner:



3. On the right hand side you'll see the following.

Upload your picture here. Either drag it from your computer to here or click to pick the picture from your computer.

Title your picture, ie Students measuring plants in the garden.

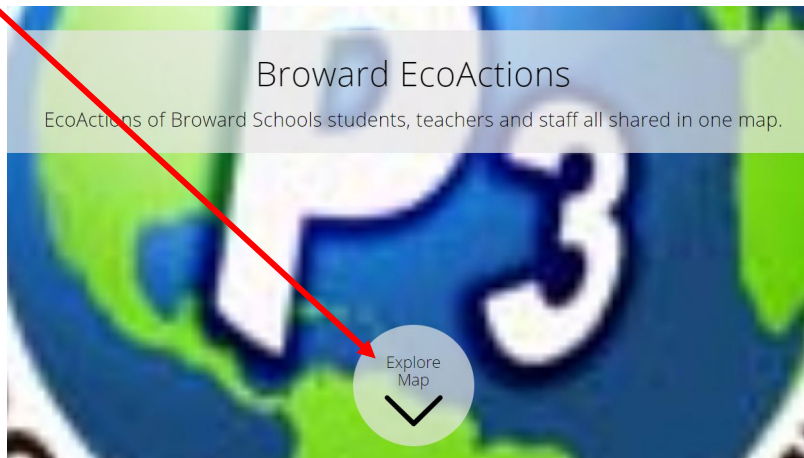
Use your school address – this is how we know that your school is the one submitting this picture.

Write a brief description of what it is we're looking at. Include your school name in the description.

Click Accept Terms and Submit

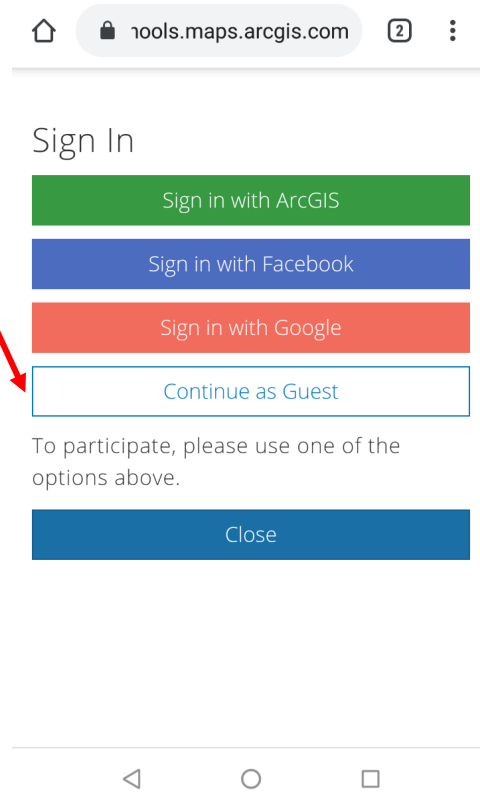

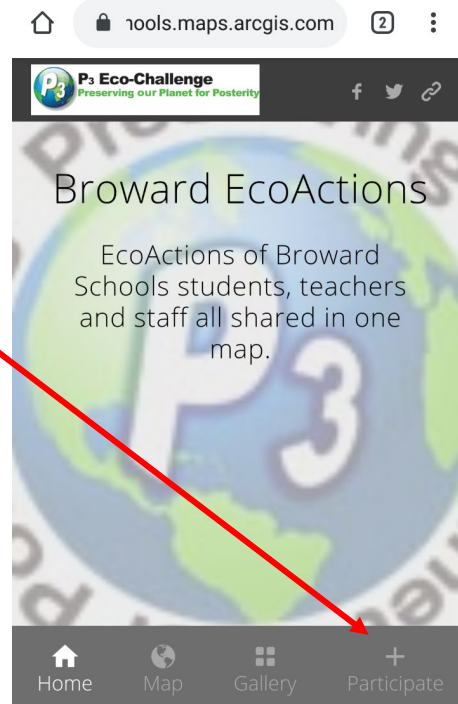


B. How to Upload Via Your Phone:

1. Go to <http://bit.ly/P3Category6>
2. When the page loads, click **Continue as Guest** :



3. Click **Participate** (bottom of page).

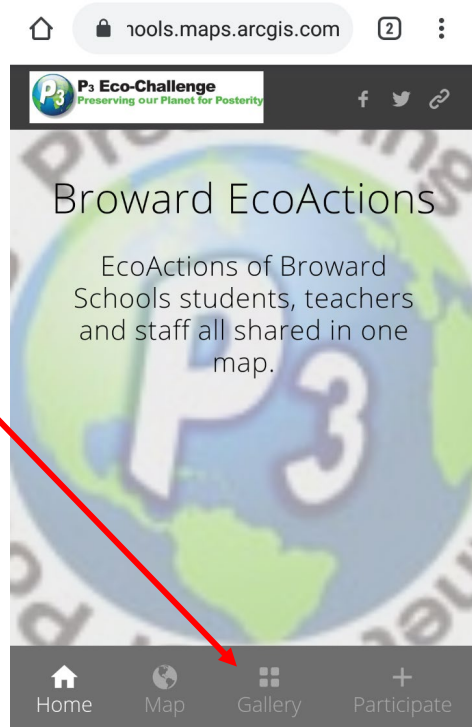
