Chief Judge Jack Tuter and the Broward County Judiciary is hosting the one-day workshop at the Main Courthouse from 10:00AM to 2:00PM in courtroom 15150.

The workshop is part of the Informed Voters Project, as endorsed by former U.S. Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, former Florida Supreme Court Justice Barbara J. Pariente and the National Association of Women Judges (NAWJ).
