1. Describe the process utilized to conduct the comprehensive needs assessment for yourschool.

2 years prior assessment data from the FSA sores, FAIR scores in reading along with Pre and Post tests were evaluated and organized with graphs, tables, and charts. In addition, we used iReady scores in LA & Math for progress monitoring three times a year. Information was organized to show individual teacher, grade level, and school-wide results. Individual student results were given to classroom teachers for their review. Parents are also a vital part of the process. A parent survey is sent home each spring to gather input concerning curriculum, environment, and communication. Results of this survey are used to help write goals and objectives for the school. Parents are invited to meet with administration to discuss student achievement results and strategies for improving scores. Suggestions are discussed with staff and

The district's Human Resources and Staff Development departments, as well as district level Recruitment Committee work collaboratively to retain and recruit highly qualified certified in field, effective teachers. Vacancies are filled with candidates interviewed at the recruitment fair. We retain our teachers by using New Educational Support System (Tier), PLCs, District Training, School Based PDs, and Incentives. We also continually recognize our teacher with incentives for effective teaching practices and student gains.

Ramblewood Middle School uses Title 1 funds to hire additional teachers to assist with our low performing students. Staff Development funds are used to develop a comprehensive professional training program to improve delivery of instruction through a variety of workshops designed to move teachers to mastery and improve student achievement. Parental Involvement funds are utilized to increase parental involvement through academic parent nights that provide parents with new skills to support student learning at home. Improving the frequency and quality of family participation and increasing family literacy are also goals of our parental involvement component. Funds are used to purchase food, supplies/materials and provide stipends for teacher presenters. (Some of these events were in person and some were virtual).

All students are being instructed by certified, ESOL endorsed teachers. Ramblewood Middle School employs a paraprofessional who works closely with our ELL population. This staff member serves as liaison between the school and ELL community. The Multi-Cultural department provides ESOL with materials and resources needed.

The faculty and staff at RMS are responsible for helping to identify homeless students and referring them to the Homeless Education program offered by the district. The purpose of the Homeless Education Program is to identify homeless students, remove barriers to their education, including school enrollment, provide them with supplemental academic and counseling case management services as well as linkages to their school social worker while maintaining school as the students 'stable environment.

10. Violence Prevention

RMS implements the County Student Code of Conduct and follows the District Discipline Matrix. Our school enforces the District 's Anti-Bullying Policy and has a zero tolerance for bullying and violence. Bullying prevention programs are supported through Youth Crime Watch, Peer Counseling/Conflict Mediation programs, guest speakers and student assemblies. In addition, RMS offers a Suicide Training PD to all its staff members.

11. Nutrition Program

Nutritional programs and health education are an integral part of our school, specifically through the Physical Educational curriculum and federal initiatives of the Broward County Public Schools Food & Nutrition Department. We offer all of our students free breakfast and lunch.

12. Housing Programs

Referrals are made to the school social worker, when parents need housing or food. Additionally, the front office staff takes note of families expressing a need and passes this information on to administration and/or the guidance counselor.
