# Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early!

Success in school goes hand in hand with good attendance. Did you know?

- Starting in Kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down teaching to help children catch up.

In science, we have studied rocks, the life cycle and severe weather.

So as you can see, we have been working very hard. While on break try and have your child go on iReady Reading and Math as much as possible. Also, they can read a book and write a book report on it.

## 3rd Grade

Season's greetings from the Third-grade team! We are diligently working on students mastering all the standards as we prepare our students for the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA). In reading, we are working on identifying text and graphic features, comparing and contrasting different points-of-view, and connecting words and pictures when reading informational text. In math, students are learning multiplication facts and strategies. It is vital that students know their multiplication tables. We will also begin learning about fractions. In 3rd grade, students should be able to identify that a fraction represents a whole number that has been divided into equal parts. ## 4th Grade

This the season to be jolly!!!!! As we gear up for the New Year, a lot of important assessment dates are approaching quickly such as our 4th grade writing assessment in two months. We are currently working on Opinion Writing. In ELA we are working and exposing the students to all the Reading standards. In Math we are wrapping up Factors, Multiples, and Patterns, and getting ready for Fractions. Please continue working with your child on multiplication and division as this is an ongoing skill. # 5th Grade

Our "awesome" 5th grade students at Palm Cove Elementary have been very busy at work with their teachers in the classroom learning about the different reading strategies. In addition, the students are learning about two different writing styles, informative and opinionated. The students would read two different articles and write an informative or an opinionated paper based on those articles they had read. Furthermore, the students are learning a variety of ways to model and explain how to solve math problems. Last, but least, the 5th grade students are learning a plethora of science vocabulary words and their definitions in relation to the "Water Cycle," "Weather and Climate," "Matter," "Mixtures and Solutions," and much more.

Furthermore, the students are preparing to attend a field trip to JA BizTown in January 2019. Prior to attending this field trip, the students are learning a lot about operating their own businesses and handling their own checking accounts etc. This will give the students the opportunity to put their knowledge to work and hopefully see success for themselves and their businesses. The 5th grade teachers need as many parents who have been cleared through Broward County Public School System to volunteer for this fantastic field trip.

Please continue to make sure your child arrives on time to school to prevent tardiness and any missed information of learning that's taking place in the classroom.







Attendance - School Board Policy 5.5. Attendance is important to student success. Broward County Schools has established a "pattern of attendance" to meet state requirements. We are required to count both excused and unexcused absences, along with tardiness and early sign-outs when determining a student's pattern of non-attendance. A student will have a "pattern of non-attendance" if he or she is absent from school a total of 30 hours (5 days) in any one marking period or 60 hours (10 days) within 90 days. If it is determined by a school that a student has developed "pattern of non-attendance", sanctions may be imposed. Sanctions may range, for an elementary age student, from having his or her report card withheld if they were in school for less than 25 days in a marking period, to the child's parent being required to appear in court.

Each time your child is absent you are required to notify the school by telephone (754-323-6802) within 48 hours stating the reason for the absence. If the school is not notified the absence is considered unexcused. After attempted interventions by the school to correct unexcused absences, the Office of the State Attorney will intervene to ensure compliance with the law. We comply with the BTIP process.

Excused absences include: Student illness; Illness of an immediate family member; Death in the family; Religious holidays of student's specific faith; Required court appearance or subpoena by a law enforcement agency; Important public functions/conferences, State/national competitions; Scheduled doctor or dentist appointment; Communicable disease or infestation which can be transmitted.
