Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early!

Success in school goes hand in hand with good attendance.

- Did you know?
- Starting in Kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down teaching to help children catch up.

Kindergarten

We begin the month of November with many exciting activities in store for Kindergarten. In Language Arts, we will be working on blending sounds and recognizing dolch sight words. In math, we will learn about the numbers 10-19 and we will begin addition. In Science, we will continue learning about living things. In Social Studies, we will learn about The First Thanksgiving, Pilgrims and Native Americans. Please continue to work with your child at home on letter names, letter sounds, shapes, colors, Level One and Two Dolch sight words, numbers 0 to 20 and addition up to 20. There are many FREE apps on the ipad and iphone students can use to help with these skills--Check Them Out!

1st Grade

Our Fantastic First Graders have been very busy during the first quarter and we can't believe it has come to an end. They've worked diligently and will continue to learn math addition and subtraction facts from our "GoMath" series, hands-on-Science and Reading Strategies using our Florida Standards.

Parents, please continue to read to your child every night. Make sure your child practices the Dolch Words. Discuss reading materials together, ask questions about why the author wrote the story, sequence of events in the story, and ask them to give details related to the story.

We were delighted to see the children dressed up in their favorite character from their chosen story in our Storybook Parade.

2nd Grade

Happy November!!! Second grade students will be focusing on the following skills for this month in English Language Arts: Comprehension, Text Features, Character, Setting and Plot. Please read different genres of stories to your child and discuss these skills with your child. In Mathematics: Place Value, Addition and Subtraction and Problem Solving. Some reminders: Try and have your child go on i-ready and make sure their homework is completed.

3rd Grade

Season's greetings from the Third-grade team! We are diligently working on students mastering all the standards as we prepare our students for the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA). In reading we are working on identifying text and graphic features, asking and answering questions, and main idea. In math, students are learning multiplication facts and various problemsolving strategies. It is vital that students know their multiplication tables so please encourage them to practice daily. In science, students are exploring the different forms of energy. Parents please ensure that students are reading nightly for at least 20 minutes and planners should be signed daily. Thank you for your continued support!

4th Grade

In Reading we are Focusing on Literary text. Students should able to identify the differences between both literary and nonfiction text. In Math we are working on multiplying 2-digit by 2-digit numbers using several different strategies. In Science we are classifying Rocks. Writing Opinion. Please review Times Tables with students daily, also monitor your child's i-Ready data in Reading and Math. Home- Work is even Monday-Thursday. Student must bring Agendas to school daily.

5th Grade

Fifth grade is deep in learning and we are excited for what this school year has in store! The month of November is a fun one for 5th Grade! As we all look forward to our Thanksgiving Break, make sure we are all using the resources available to us, so that we stay on the path to success! Use i-Ready daily...you will soon be rewarded for your hard work!!

In math, we've already covered multiplication and division, so now it's time to conquer everything about decimals! Don't forget to memorize your multiplication facts every night! In Science, we will be learning about the human body! Students are excited about this! In Language Arts, our 5th graders will be working on Theme.



Attendance - School Board Policy 5.5. Attendance is important to student success. Broward County Schools has established a "pattern of attendance" to meet state requirements. We are required to count both excused and unexcused absences, along with tardiness and early sign-outs when determining a student's pattern of non-attendance. A student will have a "pattern of non-attendance" if he or she is absent from school a total of 30 hours (5 days) in any one marking period or 60 hours (10 days) within 90 days. If it is determined by a school that a student has developed "pattern of non-attendance", sanctions may be imposed. Sanctions may range, for an elementary age student, from having his or her report card withheld if they were in school for less than 25 days in a marking period, to the child's parent being required to appear in court.

Each time your child is absent you are required to notify the school by telephone (754-323-6802) within 48 hours stating the reason for the absence. If the school is not notified the absence is considered unexcused. After attempted interventions by the school to correct unexcused absences, the Office of the State Attorney will intervene to ensure compliance with the law. We comply with the BTIP process.

Excused absences include: Student illness; Illness of an immediate family member; Death in the family; Religious holidays of student's specific faith; Required court appearance or subpoena by a law enforcement agency; Important public functions/conferences, State/national competitions; Scheduled doctor or dentist appointment; Communicable disease or infestation which can be transmitted.
