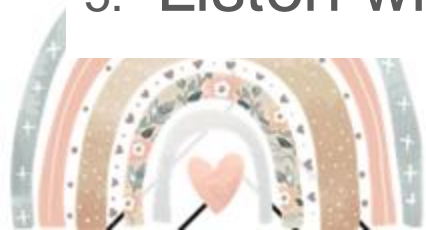

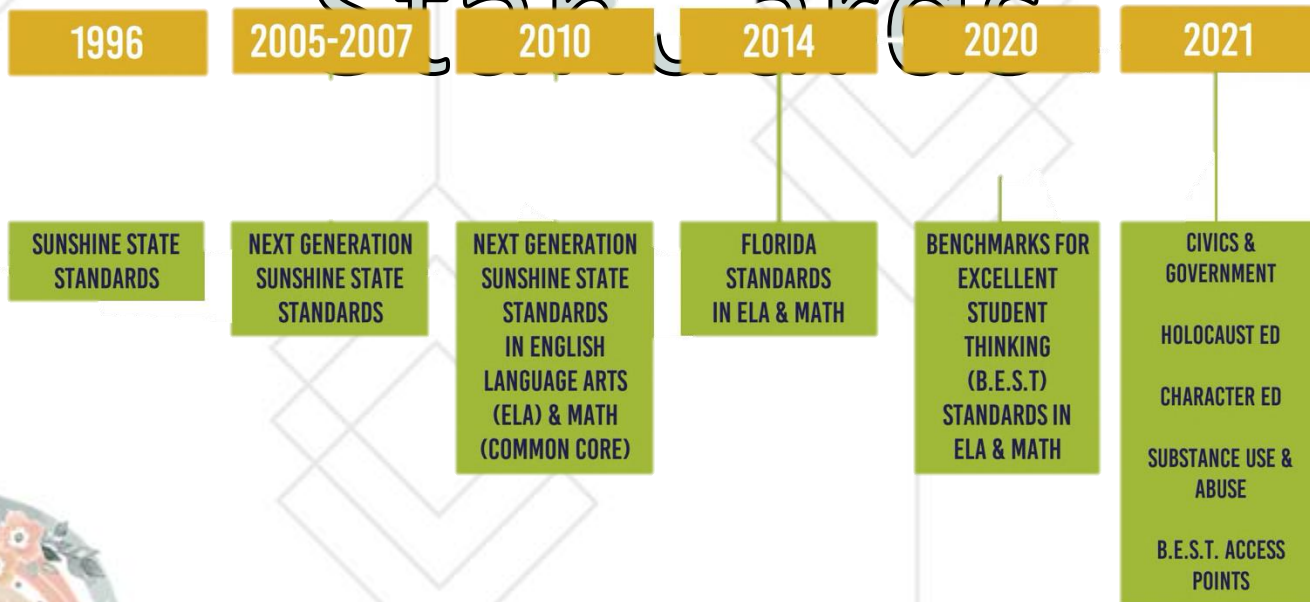
CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

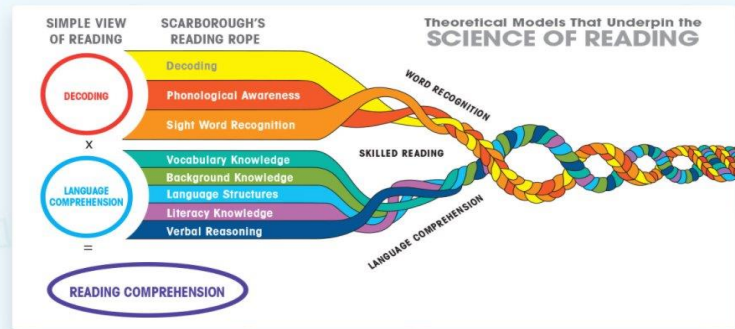

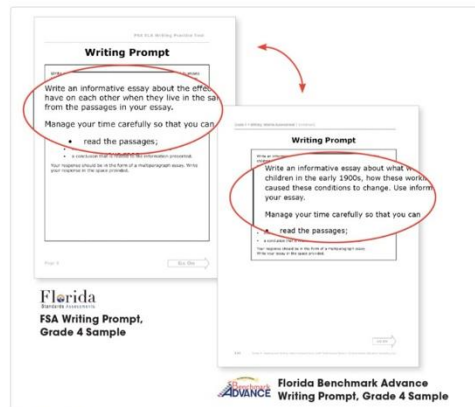

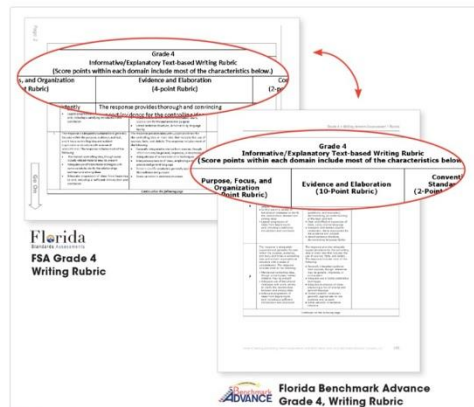

- Publishing

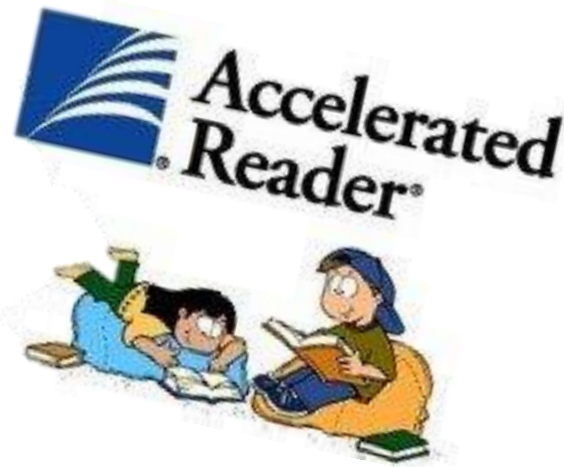

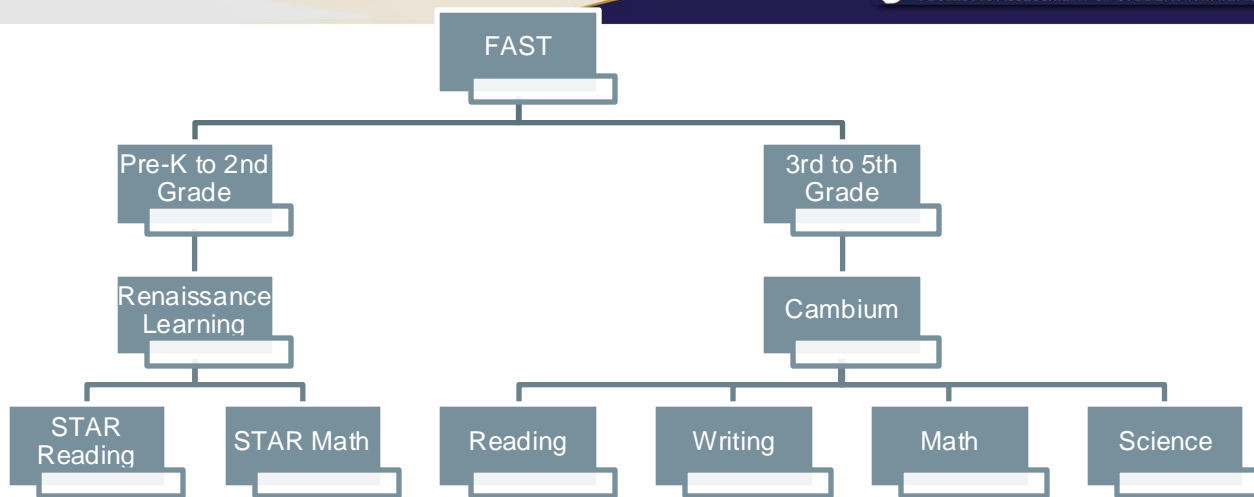
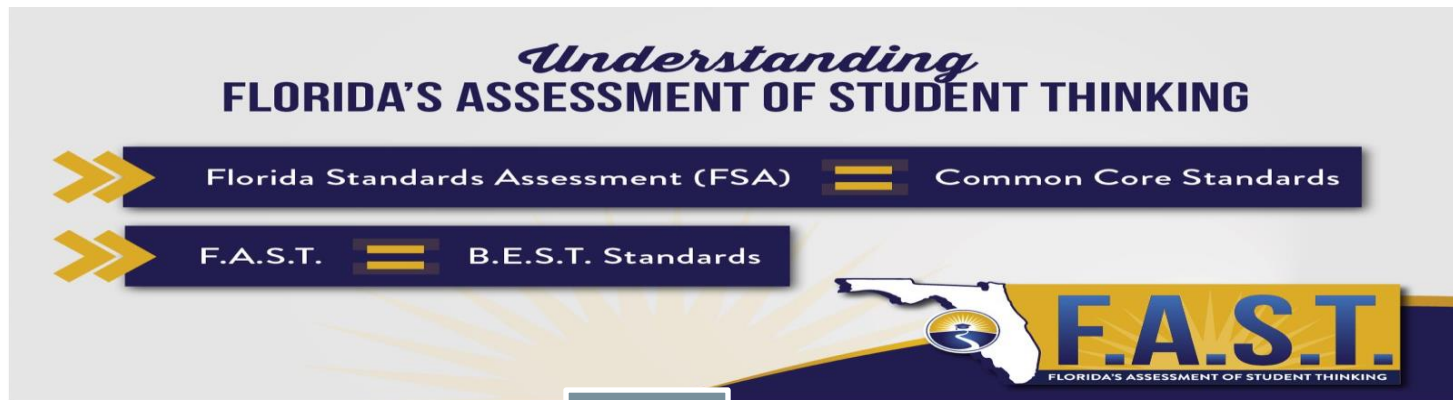
i-Ready

HOMework

- Homework is important to each student's educational experience:
 - Reinforce skills taught in the classroom
 - Provide the student with an opportunity for independent practice
 - Study classroom materials
 - Explore and master skills more thoroughly than class time allows
 - Encourages responsibility, study skills, and self-discipline






HOMework Policy

- ELA homework is given each Monday and is due Friday. This includes comprehension, grammar, and vocabulary.
- Math homework is assigned daily and due the next day. It is a daily review based on lessons taught from the enVision textbook.
- School board policy 10 minutes per grade level
- Make-up Work: For every absence, the student is allowed 2 school days



WHY READ 20 MINUTES AT HOME?

Student A Reads	Student B Reads	Student C Reads
❖ 20 minutes per day.	❖ 5 minutes per day.	❖ 1 minute per day
❖ 3,600 minutes per school year.	❖ 900 minutes per school year.	❖ 180 minutes per school year.
❖ 1,800,000 words per year.	❖ 282,000 words per year.	❖ 8,000 words per year.
		
❖ Scores in the 90 th percentile on standardized tests.	❖ Scores in the 50 th percentile on standardized tests.	❖ Scores in the 10 th percentile on standardized tests.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.

Class Work

- Expected to be completed on time
- I offer help whenever students ask, except on tests
- I have been giving students their work back when directions are not followed and allowing them to correct mistakes.
- If a student receives a D or an F they can correct the assignment and turn it back in to improve their grade by one letter grade (An F will become a D and a D will become a C if the child does the work correctly).



Online Work

- Students complete all tests online
- They also complete many assignments online
- This is great practice for the FAST since it is fully online
- Online assignment scores are often not sent home because there is not a paper to put in red folders.
- Please check Savvas and Benchmark through Clever to view online assignments or tests.
- Students log onto online programs often in class and should be able to find the assignments if you ask for their help

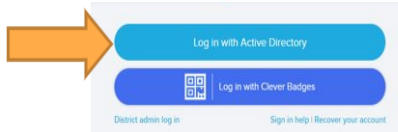

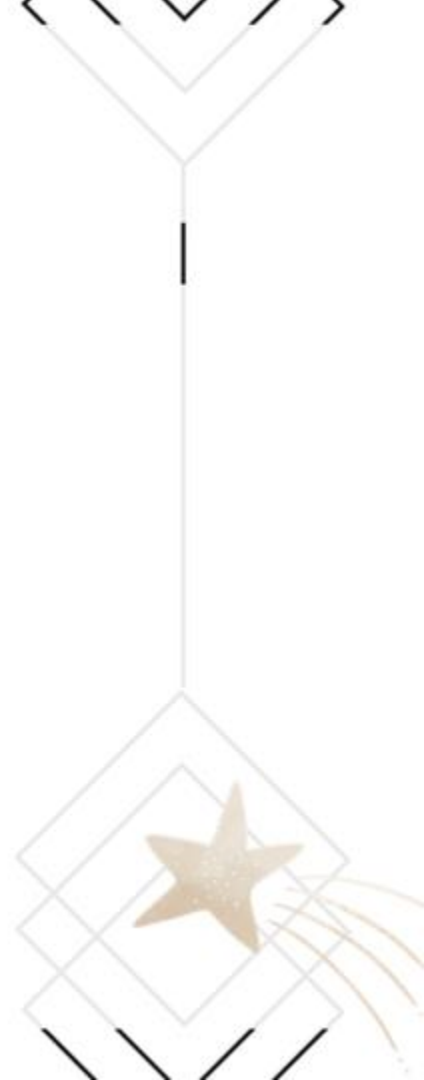

Folders/Communication

Homework (Colored Folders)

- Sent home and returned daily.

Red Folders (Harbordale logo)

- Go home on Tuesday and Returned Wednesday.
- Return any important papers.



ATTENDANCE

- School day starts promptly at 8:00 AM and ends at 2:00 PM
- Both excused and unexcused absences along with tardiness and early sign-outs will be counted when determining a student's pattern of non-attendance
- Each time your child is absent you are required to notify the school, either by telephone or through a note, within 48 hours stating the reason for the absence. If the school is not notified the absence is considered unexcused.

VOLUNTEERS

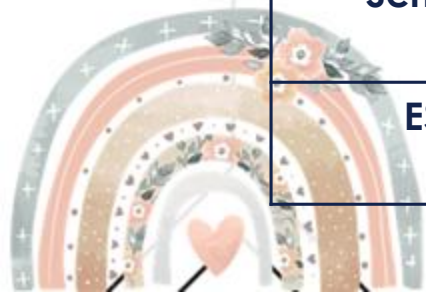
- We love volunteers! Please fill out the volunteer application online at browardschools.com/volunteer!
