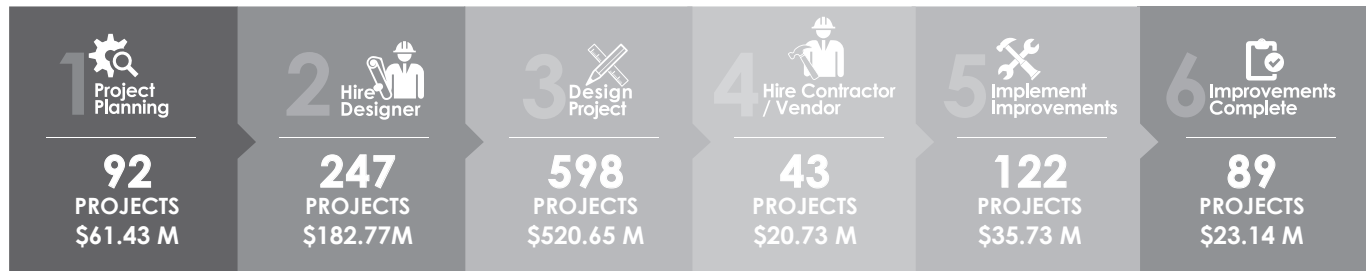

Since the last SMART Update, **1,191 SMART projects have made progress and are currently in one of the six phases of the design and implementation process** (see chart below). This number represents 87 percent of all SMART school facility projects and marks an investment of **more than \$844 million as of September 30, 2017**. The SMART Program remains on track to be completed within five to seven years, as originally promised. **Figures below represent the value of projects currently in each phase as of September 30, 2017.*



School Choice Enhancement Program

The School Choice Enhancement Program (SCEP) continues to make progress. To date, approximately 400 enhancements have been completed at 140 schools. In addition, since the last SMART update, four District schools completed their SCEP projects. Congratulations to the following schools:

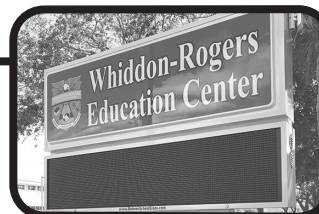
- ▶ Oakridge Elementary School (District 1) – Marquee letters, classroom carpets, printers, iPad tablets, wax machine, vacuums, testing materials and technology upgrades.
- ▶ Pine Ridge Education Center (District 3) – Projectors, television studio equipment, student privacy desks, student laptops, two-way radios and technology upgrades.
- ▶ Stirling Elementary School (District 1) – Murals, sound system in cafeteria, projectors, upgrades to the front office and conference room, bulletin board, picnic tables, collaboration tables and other technology.
- ▶ Whiddon-Rogers Education Center (District 3) – Signs, banners, backless benches, marquee replacement, cafeteria tables, interior painting, table tops, mobile tables, chairs and more.

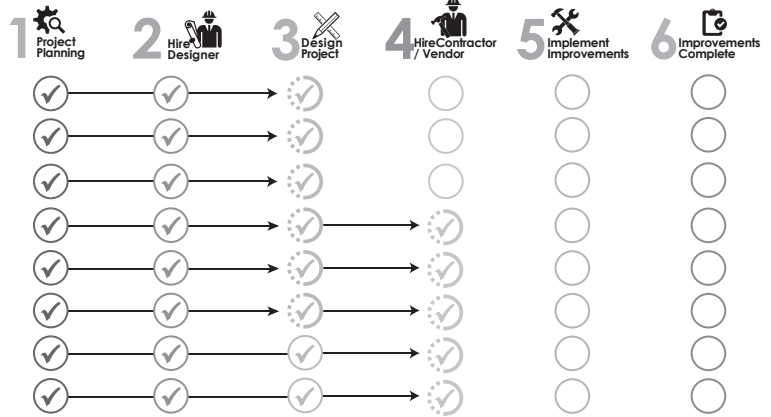

BCPS students across the District are getting pumped up about their workouts – thanks to their schools' new weight rooms. The newly renovated weight rooms are now completed at Blanche Ely High School and Piper High School, and new weight rooms at Cypress Bay High School, Nova High School and Stranahan High School are close behind. The weight rooms for those three schools are expected to be finished by the end of November 2017.

In addition, Coconut Creek High School and Dillard High School (6-12) are counting down to their new weight rooms, which are expected to be completed prior to the Winter Break. Many of the remaining high school weight room renovation projects are in various stages of the process, from finalizing their designs and ADA review - to placing purchase orders and delivery. By December 30, 2018, all 30 high school weight room projects are expected to be completed.

BCPS is proud to announce that the **SMART technology rollout to schools is now completed**. The technology initiative included 13,166 additional wireless access points for schools Districtwide, 83,362 new computer devices installed at schools, new infrastructure and equipment, and an **overall investment of more than \$67.5 million**.

"Technology impacts how students learn, gather information and communicate with others. For our students to be successful 21st century learners, we must have the technology in our schools necessary to support their education," said Superintendent Robert W. Runcie. "Through the SMART Program, there are now more computers and wireless access points than ever before ready to support our students. We have improved our District's student to computer ratio from 6-to-1 to approximately 2-to-1 – and the work was completed ahead of schedule and under budget. Congratulations to all of those who worked tirelessly on the technology initiative for the benefit of our students." Below are the final 30 schools which were completed since the last SMART update:
