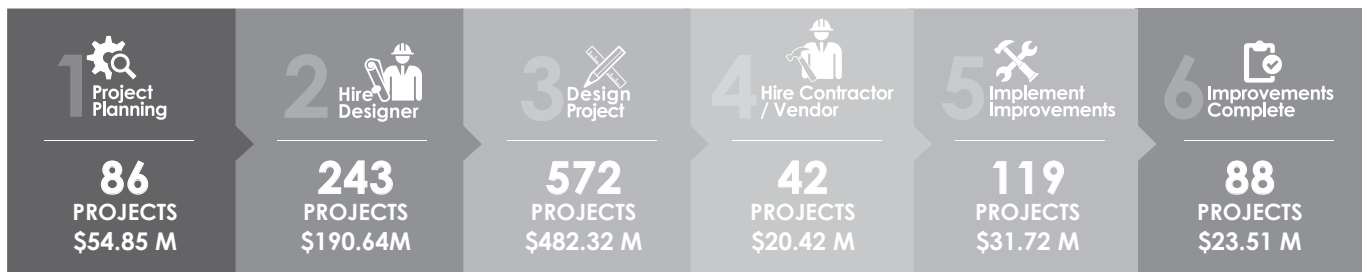

Since our last SMART Update, **1,150 SMART projects have made progress** and are currently in one of the six phases of the design and implementation process. The number represents **84 percent of all SMART facility projects** and marks an **investment of more than \$803 million as of August 31, 2017**. The SMART Program remains on track to be completed within five to seven years, as originally promised. To ensure projects are completed with the utmost efficiency and integrity, each project typically goes through a six-phase process, as illustrated in the chart below. **Figures below represent the value of projects currently in each phase as of August 31, 2017.*

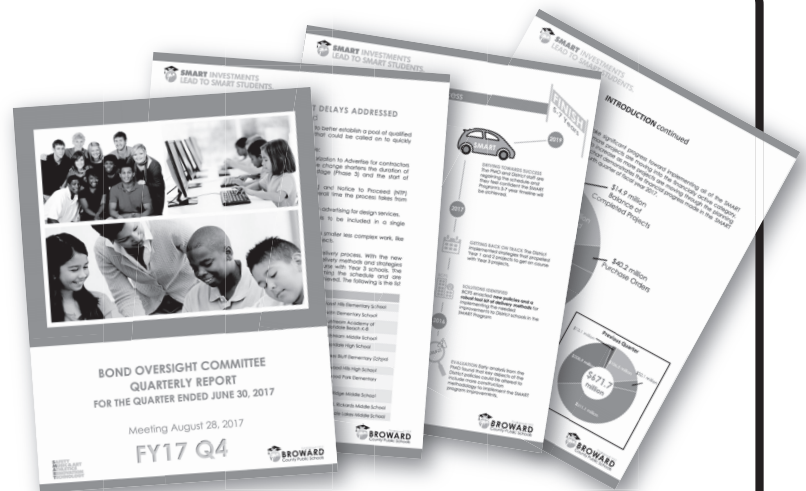

Bond Oversight Committee

To promote transparency and accountability, District officials established the Bond Oversight Committee (BOC), an independent panel that reviews and reports on all bond fund investments to ensure expenditures adhere to the purpose for which they are authorized. On August 28, 2017, District staff presented the latest SMART Quarterly Progress Report to the BOC. The next BOC meeting is scheduled for November 13, 2017.

SMART Music & Art

New Musical Instruments and Equipment

The SMART Music program continues to soar! BCPS has successfully completed the ordering process for new instruments and equipment for every school offering music. Deliveries of the new items are ongoing.

Since the start of the SMART program, 33,127 instruments and musical equipment items have been delivered to District schools, with 24,259 more items ordered and on the way to schools. This represents an investment of more than \$17 million to ensure BCPS students have the instruments they need to develop and enhance their music education.

New Kilns

To date, 17 new kilns have been delivered to District schools. An additional 15 kilns have been ordered and are in the process of being delivered. The District expects to provide 40 more kilns for schools across the District to support visual art programs.

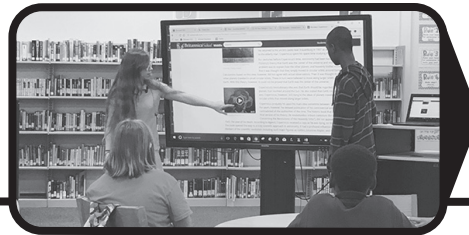
**Computer Gap Project Completed*

The SMART Technology continues to move full-speed ahead, with **200 schools now completed**, including receiving new infrastructure/network equipment, wireless access points and computer devices. The SMART Technology work to date represents an investment of **more than \$66.6 million** as of August 31, 2017. Since the last SMART Update, 11 schools were completed, including:

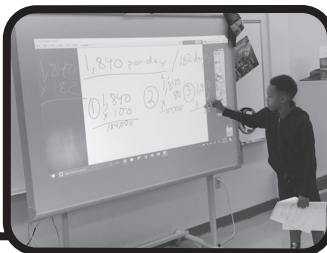

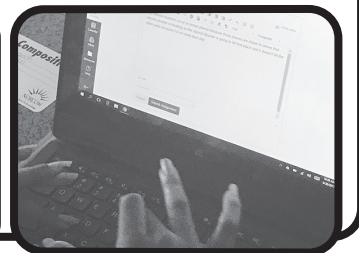
